Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What are we doing? That depends on what (or who) we are.

If we are the body of Christ, then the parts of the body work together for the good of the body. If we are the family of God, then we share in the responsibilities of the family.

With excitement, I share what we are doing because of what (or who) we are. The body of Christ at St. Paul Lutheran in Millington is working together in many ways. Various people are working toward a common goal to increase worship attendance.

Simply put, we believe that the more often people are in worship, the more God will work in their hearts through His Word. This is true for you also. We are trying to involve more people in the worship service, whether it is through children's messages, musical groups, or the use of technology and drama. The bottom line is how can we work together to worship Jesus and also share Jesus with others inside and outside the church?

In terms of being family, I have a request of you. When you (or a loved one) enter the hospital, please make sure the hospital puts on your records that St. Paul Lutheran is your home church. You will need to do this every time you are admitted. You may also want to call the church office. Unless you tell them and call us, we won't know you are there. What I am saying is that we have found many of our members are "invisible" to us when in the hospital. We have a wonderful group of people on the Christian Care Committee that are helping me to make visits whenever members are hospitalized. We want to share God's peace and joy with you during your stay. Because we are family in Christ, we are trying our best to be there for each other.

Keeping the family informed is important. There are many responsibilities that we share and need to coordinate. Be on the look out for a special celebration to coincide with the "Faith For the Journey" Celebration date anniversary. We want to have everyone in the family write a Scripture verse on the Activities Center floor before they put down the wood floor. We want God's Word to be the foundation of the activities hosted there. We also hope to have the dedication of the completed project in late July. I work continually with people to plan activities that will utilize this newest tool for ministry.

We are also preparing for our next Call Meeting. We will ask God the Holy Spirit to guide us in the process of calling an Associate Pastor. The meeting is set for June 3<sup>rd</sup> at 7:30 p.m.

We have parts of the body making preparations for special Bible studies to be offered in the Fall. We want to help the body develop more skills. We want everyone to be "Living Your Strengths" or the way God created you. We also hope many will take advantage of the Bible study material provided by the Crown Financial ministry. This will help us learn how to better manage God's resources during these difficult economic times. If you are interested in being a trained host or leader for either of these please speak with me or Greg Mohr from the Board of Stewardship.

Using our voice as the Christian body has always been necessary. There are numerous attacks on our freedoms as Christians, so I urge you to speak up (or write). See the information in this Messenger concerning the life issue and the religious freedom issues.

Letters to our U.S. Senators and U.S. House Members are needed.

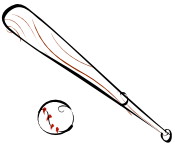

The Pentagon under the Obama Administration has just acknowledged **seizing and burning the privately owned Bibles** of American soldiers serving in Afghanistan. The Bibles had been printed in the local Pashto and Dari languages, and sent by private donors to American Christian soldiers and chaplains, for distribution to American troops on overseas military bases during optionally-attended Christian worship services. Had the Bibles not been seized and destroyed, they could have legally been given as gifts during off-duty time to Afghani citizens.

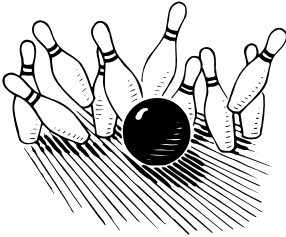
