A Message from Pastor Martinal

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In 1 Corinthians 12:12-31a, Paul notes that all believers are members of the Body of Christ. And, just like a body which is made up of hands and feet and legs and arms, all believers have unique gifts and functions in the Body of Christ. In fact, "God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as He chose" (1 Corinthians 12:18).

And God, through the Holy Spirit, has empowered you with various gifts. We are not all "eyes" or "ears". And we can't function as a healthy Body by being made up of only "hands" or "feet". "If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, yet one body" (1 Corinthians 12:19-20). The Body is like a choir or an orchestra, where each singer or musician has an assigned and vital role in producing a pleasing result.

We are united to Christ and to one another *because* we are one in the Body of Christ. This means we have a deep organic unity in Christ. Therefore, "if one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together" (1 Corinthians 12:26). As Christians, we are to "rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep" (Romans 12:15). We are not to be indifferent to the welfare of others but seek and rejoice in the good of all.

For this reason, to be a Christian *is* to be in a congregation and in the communion of saints. This is the only community in the world in which God "daily and richly forgives my sins and the sins of all believers" (Small Catechism, Apostles' Creed, 3rd Article, Explanation). This is the only community founded on the teaching, work, and saving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The only community in which there is salvation, for it is the gathering of all who believe in Jesus Christ, who comes to us in His Word and Sacraments.

As the Body of Christ, as a community of believers gathered at St. Paul, our mission is

to confess and proclaim the forgiveness of sins for Jesus' sake and daily witnessing "the excellencies of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). We are to regularly receive Word and Sacraments within our community. And we are to tell others about Jesus, participate in works of mercy and service, and support the ministry of the Church with prayer and financial gifts.

So, is there room for you in the Body of Christ? Absolutely! Through the waters of Holy Baptism and by faith, you are already a member! And if you're struggling to determine whether you are a "foot", "hand", "eye", "ear", etc., please speak to an elder or pastor, and we can prayerfully discern where God is calling you to serve. The Body of Christ is supplied with a diversity of gifts from God, some greater, some lesser, but all with a necessary part to play in building up the Body.

Later this year, during the Season of Lent, we will be exploring what it means to be a church member, a member of the Body of Christ. I strongly encourage you to attend this 6-week exploration. We believe it is vitally important so that the Body of Christ gathered at St. Paul can be a healthy, active Body in the kingdom of God. Be on the lookout for more information soon.

The Body of Christ, the Church, will always exist. Will life in the Body of Christ be one of continual peace and harmony? No, not in this life. For Satan is a sore loser and continually lashes out in desperation against us. But on the Last Day, we, and all the Body of Christ, will celebrate the final victory over sin, death, and Satan when Christ returns. Then, the Body of Christ will be complete and holy in the presence of our Triune God forevermore.

You are created and loved by God the Father, redeemed and sent by Jesus Christ, and made holy and empowered by the Holy Spirit to love and serve humbly according to your calling,





On-Line Giving. Some of you participate in on-line giving; others would like to, but find the ability to contribute too restrictive. As of December 31, 2018 our on-line program, Excel in Giving, is history. All present participants have been cancelled.

Church Extension Fund is going to underwrite some of the fees associated with on-line giving in a new program called Kindrid. A few folks in the church are presently driving through the new software to see how it works. You should be able to establish your own account, give when you're able, in any amount, from a phone, from a computer, credit card, ACH from bank, etc, etc. You'll be hearing more about this software as soon after we have analyzed the impact to the church (we will have to absorb some of the transaction fees....possibly).

There are many yearly Bible reading plans to choose from. Many of us may make New Year's resolutions to read through the entire Bible in the coming year. "This is the year!", we boldly promise. But by mid-February, in the midst of Leviticus, we often roll our eyes at the thought of continuing one more day reading about "cleansing from infections skin diseases" and "rules for priests". So, we quit, until next year. But that doesn't mean we shouldn't read the Bible. So, we're inviting you to read the Bible with us in 2019.

What makes this Bible reading plan different? Well, we're not reading the entire Bible, although you're certainly able and encouraged to do so. Instead, we're reading the great stories of the Bible. Each week, we're asking you to read 3 stories. We're encouraging you to set aside 10-15 minutes for 3 days each week to immerse yourself in the Word of God. It helps to do this at the same time of day each time you read a story if you can. Included in this Messenger are the great stories we are reading in January. If you are married, try to do this together. If you have children, let them read from the Bible if they are able. Try discussing the questions provided and pray the prayer together.

Over the next several months, we'll read 100+ great stories of the Bible together. And while we won't read the entire Bible, we hope you will grow in your appreciation for reading it together and praying together. God's truth about Jesus Christ, namely the promise of the forgiveness of sins for Jesus' sake, is made known in the Bible. As Jesus said in John, "If you abide in My word, you are truly My disciples"; "whoever abides in Me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing." And, as Paul writes in 2 Timothy 3:16-17, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the [people] of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."

May God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless our reading of His Word as we abide in His Word in 2019!

NOTICE AS REQUIRED BY AHERA

On January 23, 1998, we had St. Paul Lutheran Church and School reinspected for asbestos hazard by Digus Consultant Company. They are Environmental Protection Agency accredited and Michigan Department of Public Health licensed as inspectors and management planners. This reinspection was performed in compliance with AHERA-Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act.

Although we do have some asbestos in our building, some response actions and periodic surveillance will help control possible hazard to our congregation, students, staff, parents or guardians, custodians, part-time workers, or contractors.

This reinspection report will be included in the management plan and is available for your inspection by appointment only with Raymond Leach, the Asbestos Program Manager for our church and school.

Reinspection of these materials at St. Paul Lutheran Church and School, Millington, shall be conducted at least once every three years. Annual notification shall be issued and updated information shall be made available.


