What do sports, politics, and church have in com-

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

mon? Teamwork. Commitment. Faith. When these three things are working, teams, political parties, and congregations flourish. If any one or all three of these elements are missing, they will be limited, ineffective, or even dissolve.

In any team sport, unselfish teamwork is a benchmark for success. While stars can be important, they still need help from everyone else on the team in order to get to the top. The same is true of political parties. Candidates can rise from a grassroots campaign to a nationally elected position only by the hard work and dedication of many hundreds of others.

By God's grace, we're celebrating 125 years as a congregation, and nearly 120 years with a school because of teamwork. This is the teamwork of past generations who sacrificed so we have a Christian heritage, our property, and our facility. This is the teamwork of volunteers who presently plan, work, or coordinate with our hard-working staff. This is the teamwork of elected volunteers who provide leadership and action to take care of our mission and ministry, property and business. This is the teamwork of members who give to support God's kingdom here and abroad. The sole motivation for this team effort is Jesus Christ, our crucified and risen Lord, who is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Commitment of a sports organization and its players is essential to success. If, for example, a player shows poor or mediocre effort, or has a conflict with a coach or organization, the whole team suffers. Worse than a physical injury, a poor or hostile attitude can have a demoralizing impact on the entire organization. Likewise, a solid commitment to the team, the organization, and their goals will accomplish much.

Commitment is needed both for politicians and those supporting them as well. If a politician isn't committed to any causes or platforms, if they display poor or mediocre effort, or are in constant conflict with others, they won't be very effective. In the same way, if politicians don't have commitment from people supporting them, all of their best efforts, ideas, and influence will be of little use as they will lack the tools, financial resources, and people power to do much of anything. A strong commitment from all involved is necessary to achieve any objective.

We know God is committed to us as He sent His only Son to die for us and our sins. In our confirmation vows we make a commitment to God. With God's help, we have promised to conform our lives to and be faithful with the Word and Sacraments. We are to suffer all, even death, rather than forsake the faith. Our commitment is to Christ who commands us to love, forgive, and serve one another. Our support of "equipping the saints for works of ministry" (Ephesians 4:11-16) and "making disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:18-20) are God's top priorities.

Faith, or confidence, of an individual athlete means everything for performance. Those who believe they won't "make the shot", "catch the ball", or "score" will probably not do well. On the other hand, a steely resolve and disciplined practice to master the fundamental skills are often rewarded with a team that wins.

Faith, or confidence, in a political party or candidate is often the only way we vote. Those who are untrustworthy or support platforms and policies we lack confidence in, will usually not garner our support, our commitment. Those running for political office must also have faith in what they stand for, or people won't follow them or commit. It takes a measure of faith to vote or run for office.

When it comes to faith in Jesus, this is a matter much bigger than ourselves. Our faith is a gift from God. The belief that Jesus is our crucified and risen Lord and Savior from sin, death, and the power of the devil means we won't feel the fires of hell. We have the "peace of God that surpasses all understanding" (Philippians 4:6). We have the assurance of sins forgiven and the promise of everlasting life. We have the privilege of talking with our Heavenly Father through prayer. Our faith brings us all the blessings and promises of God. Is there anything more important in this life?

And while sports and politics have ascended to religious status in the United States, only one person is truly worthy of such fervent devotion, time, support, commitment, and work: Jesus Christ! Ask yourself, are you a "team player" for Jesus? How committed are you to Jesus? Do you exercise your faith among your church teammates whom the Lord has called you to love and work with?

In 125 years, few will remember or care who the various sports champions are. In fact, many of the teams we cheer for so fanatically today may not be around in 125 years. Few will remember or care who was in what political office in 125 years. However, we do know Jesus Christ will be the same. As the Living One, He will be with us until the end of the age, and then forevermore. Plus, what we do now with the "treasures of God" (Matthew, 6:19-21, 33; 1 Corinthians 4:5-7) will have eternal significance for us and others. Our teamwork, commitment, and faith may well determine the future of St. Paul Lutheran Church and School.

Join us on God's continued mission work as part of the team of faithful followers of the One in whom all things hold together and make a difference that will last into eternity.



The Women's Shelter also wanted us to share with you: "The bags that we have received from you in the past are perfect for the needs of our clients in the shelter (shampoo, conditioner, body wash, comb, brush, toothpaste, toothbrush, razor). The following is a list of items that we would like to give the clients when they get a place of their own. Ten Tons of Relief Sent March 22

Twenty-six pallets holding 1,233 boxes including distribution of more than a thousand blankets and quilts, plus generous quantities of new underclothes, towels, detergent, diapers, and sanitary supplies, all desperately needed, left the Michigan Branch of Orphan Grain Train following a two-week intensive branch effort. Wonderful and caring volunteers devoted exemplary effort and time to receive and process the multiple of deliveries which came to the Sebewaing Center within only a few days. It was a joy for us to send a full 53' trailer load of these relief supplies now on their way to displaced and homeless Ukranians. The outpouring of funding has also left us speechless. Financial gifts totaling \$41,789 received to date have been remitted also entirely to further the efforts of Orphan Grain Train in meeting the critical needs of unnumbered Ukrainians flooding into neighboring countries. Orphan Grain Train--Michigan has applied all funds received for this effort--in their entirety--to acquire further humanitarian supplies and support swift international shipping. Thank you to everyone who donated.
