Administrative Pastor - Printed Report

- Introducing Pastor Martinal to our shut-ins and took him on a tour to the Saginaw hospitals.
- 30 shut-ins. Two with the Lord. Five have been worshiping. Three are unreachable. Remaining 20 have been visited at least once (and 13 have been visited twice this last quarter.)
- Have referred several people to Crossroads Counseling in Frankenmuth. We provide some financial assistance and have used up our budget line item. Additional funding was found through Memorials. Members would benefit in knowing this is one of the ways we provide ministry to others.
- Began promoting our SPL ministries and needs they might have through the Messenger and bulletin. Also started sharing information about ministries in the MI District that members could support and volunteer. The goal is to help members see where they are working together as the body of Christ to provide emotional, physical and spiritual care, so they will continue to be engaged in the ministry of SPL.
- Sunday morning Bible class on Book of James. 30 or more in attendance each week.
- Began Jr. and Adult Confirmation Classes.
- Working on a focal point that will help members recognize Jesus at work in their past and present lives. It is our hope that members will share examples of what God is doing in and through them now and look forward with confidence and excitement for more of the same. Ex: What is your Confirmation verse and how has God used it in your life?
- LEAP is discussing with Concordia Plan forming a potential group for health insurance purposes that could result in savings. LEAP shops what has LEAP accomplished. Celebrating teaching staffs.
- Steve Kern will be the lay delegate for the Synodical Convention. We need to designate a lay voter to cast the vote for President and Vice President.

Attachment B

Submitted by Board of Finance (By-Laws Para IV.H.1.a)

As Written:

(a) The Director of Finance shall be the overall supervising financial officer of the congregation and serve as chairman of the Board of Finance. He/she shall render regular financial reports as may be required by the Church Council and Assembly of Voters and supervise all aspects of the board's responsibilities as may be required. He/she shall receive a report from the Head Teller, indicating the totals of the various funds that have been deposited at the bank, both for church and synodical accounts. He/she shall pay all expenses approved by Staff and elected Laymen who have been given authority by the Voter's Assembly to make such expenditures. He/she shall supervise the payroll of the congregation, complete and check all reports required for the maintaining of accurate payroll records and payments (employee earnings records, payroll registers, tax reports, payroll checks, tax deposits, annuity payments, and others), and complete and check all reports required by governmental and synodical agencies. He shall receive direction on payroll rates from the Salary and Personnel Committee and shall implement them. He/she shall be directly responsible for the regular and timely supervision and work of those elected and hired by the congregation to assist him/her in completing his/her duties. He/she shall provide the At-Large Member of this Board with the necessary reports and information required for the At-Large Member to carry out his/her duties. He/she shall also work with the Director of Finance Elect to train for the duties of this position, as well as oversee the Director of Finance Elect as the main person responsible for the school finances.

Change bolded sentence to:

IV.H.1.a. He/she shall receive direction on payroll rates from the Salary and Personnel Committee for implementation.

Reason: Neutral gender to correspond with rest of paragraph. Restructuring sentence for grammar.

Submitted by Board of Finance (By-Laws Para IV.H.1.c)

As Written:

(c) The Budget Director shall supervise and prepare the annual budgets for all funds. He/she shall supervise the setting of housing allowance rates and similar matters within the operational activity area of finances.

Change to:

(c) The *Budget Director* shall supervise and prepare the annual budgets for the general fund. He/she shall supervise the incorporation of applicable housing allowances to the Salary Schedule as presented by the Salary and Personnel Committee.

Reason: Delete "all funds" and replace with "the general fund" for accuracy. Further define 'housing allowance".

Submitted by Board of Finance (By-Laws Para IV.H.1.d)

As Written:

(d) The At Large Member shall be elected and assume such duties as may be assigned by the Director of Finance. These duties shall include the monthly reconciliation of bank statements for the checking and savings accounts, and the reconciliation of revenue records kept by the Director of Finance with reports received from the Committee of Bookkeepers. A report of these reconciliations shall be given to the Director of Finance, the Congregational Chairman, and the Administrative Pastor.

Change to:

(d) The At Large Member shall be elected and assume such duties as may be assigned by the Director of Finance. These duties shall include the monthly reconciliation of bank statements (checking, savings and credit card) and compared to deposits (including teller/bookkeeping reports) and expenditures in all accounts. Any discrepancies will be immediately reported to the Director of Finance for resolution. A report of these reconciliations shall be given to the Director of Finance, the Congregational Chairman, and the Administrative Pastor. Reports will be available to council members on request.

Reason: As we move further into the electronic/cloud-based applications, printing reports is obsolete. They will always, of course, be available in printed form to those members that may request.

Submitted by Board of Finance (By-Laws Para IV.H.3.b.)

As Written:

(b) The Financial Secretary shall be responsible for the posting of member offerings and reporting the same to members at the ends of the months of March, June, September and December.

Change to:

(b) The *Financial Secretary* shall be responsible for the posting of member offerings and reporting the same to members at any time of the calendar year. Paper copies will always be available upon request at any time of the year.

Reason: Current practice is to produce statements at the end of the year for tax purposes. We end up throwing many of them away as members do not pick them up from the narthex mailbox. To mail is costly. We envision moving to electronic accounts where members will be able to obtain their own statements on as-needed basis. Paper copies will always be available upon request.

Submitted by Board of Finance (By-laws Para V.F.)

As Written:

F. The Salary and Personnel Committee shall be established to develop an annual budget with regard to salaries, housing allowances, or rents. The committee shall operate under the supervision of the Church Council. It shall be chaired by the Vice President of the congregation and shall consist of the following additional members: The Director of Finance, the Budget Director, the At Large Finance Board member, a representative from each of the following boards: Elders, Christian Education, Trustees; and three members of the congregation who shall be elected annually to serve in this capacity. (Subparagraphs continue)

Change to:

F. The Salary and Personnel Committee shall be established to develop an annual budget with regard to salaries/benefits, housing allowances, or rents. The committee shall operate under the supervision of the Church Council. It shall be chaired by the Vice President of the congregation and shall consist of the following additional members: The Director of Finance, the Budget Director, the At-Large Finance Board Member, and a representative from each of the following boards: Elders, Christian Education, and Trustees. In addition, three at-large members of the congregation shall be elected for a three-year term, with no more than one being elected in any one year. (sub paragraphs continue)

Reason: The Finance Member-at-Large person is not necessary given there are two other Finance Board members on the committee. The at-large members would serve a three-year term for continuity.

Submitted by Memorials Committee (By-Laws Para V.I.)

As Written:

I. The Memorials Committee shall consist of five members appointed annually by the Church Council, with a chairman elected annually by the committee. The terms shall be for three years, with no more than two being appointed in any one year. It will publish a catalog of gifts and memorials annually and oversee the program, including all aspects of its promotion, implementation and administration. The committee is empowered to establish any controls or accounts that it may need to carry out this function. A quarterly summary of account balances and activity shall be provided to the Director of Finance, who will present it to the Church Council and Voters Assembly.

Change to:

I. The Memorials Committee shall consist of four members appointed by the Church Council, with a chairman elected annually by the committee. The four appointed members will serve a three-year term with no more than two being appointed in any one year. A fifth member, the Memorials Treasurer, is elected by the Voters for a three-year term. The committee will prepare a report of gifts received for inclusion in the church's annual report and will include all aspects of promotion, implementation, and administration. The committee is empowered to establish any controls or accounts required to best steward the gifts received to meet the needs of the Congregation. A summary of accounts and balances shall be provided to the Director of Finance, who will present to the Church Council in January, April, July and September and to the Voter's Assembly in February and August.

Reason: Language specifies terms for each member and reflects current practices.

Submitted by Board of Finance (By-laws para V.J.)

As Written:

J. The *Audit Committee* shall consist of six members appointed annually by the Church Council. This committee shall on an annual basis verify the accuracy of all the financial records of the church and school and make recommendations to Church Council. On the advice of the council, an outside agency may be hired to audit records of the church and/or school.

Change to:

J. The *Internal Financial Examination Committee* shall consist of six members appointed annually by the Church Council. This committee shall, on an annual basis, verify the accuracy of all the financial records of the church and school and make recommendations to Church Council. On the advice of the council, an outside agency may be hired to examine records of the church and/or school.

Reason: The word "Audit" should not be used due to legal implications. This is a highly recommended change by the Michigan District LCMS Business/Finance Director.

Submitted by Church Council (By-Laws Section VI, Para 1)

As Written:

All officers and members of the Boards of Elders, Education, Trustees, Evangelism, Fellowship & Youth, Stewardship, Social Concerns, Finance, and At Large members of the Salary and Personnel Committee shall be elected by the voting members of the congregation on the second Sunday in November. Proper notification of such election shall be made to all voters in the congregation.

Change to:

All officers and members of the Board of Elders, Education, Trustees, Evangelism, Fellowship, Stewardship, Social Concerns, Finance, and At Large members of the Salary and Personnel Committee shall be elected by the voting members of the congregation on the second Sunday in November. Proper notification of such elections shall be made to all voters in the congregation.

Reason: Delete "& Youth" as the Board has been renamed to "Board of Fellowship"
