A Message from Pastor Abatelli

There is a story I read about a father who gave so much to people. He covered a lady's job at his office when they found out her father passed away, then went home and spent time with his children and did his choirs around the house.

His son knew at times his father felt discouraged. He knew he failed at times. Life knocked him down and kicked him more than once, even when he was down, but got up every time. He was respected by some, yet despised by others, but he made a difference in people's lives. His quiet persistence amazed his son. During one of the son's rough times in adolescence, the son went to his dad's office and asked him what kept him going and how he endured so much pain from people.

The father sat down saying, "I was hoping we would get to talk about this some day." Then he shared what it felt like to be alone in prayer, talking to Jesus. "There is something Jesus does for me every time I am alone with Him and pray about the challenges in my life," he said with a smile. "He does not just sit and listen to me. It is like he sets a jug of water and a basin on the floor. As I pour out my heart to Him, my failures and troubles, He pours the water in the basin and takes off my shoes. Then I think about those hands, wounded scarred hands cleansing my feet. Those hands that did and do so much for me."

Imagining the picture of Jesus washing His dad's feet, he asked, "Does Jesus say anything?"

"He listens. Sometimes I picture Him looking at me and I remember things He already said in His Word that apply to what I was facing at that moment. A lot of the time He is listening to me. When I picture Him finished with my feet, he dries them and puts my socks and shoes on, picks up the basin and jug and stands. As He turns to go, I know He's smiling at me saying, softly, 'Follow me.' That is how I describe it; that is what keeps me going."

The March Messenger is sponsored in honor of Rudy Petzold on his 80th birthday from Chet & Shirley Petzold.

The boy talked to his father more and thought about the image his dad shared. He realized what it taught Him about Jesus. Jesus is a servant to us. He did not literally come and wash his father's feet, but that action with those scarred hands reminded his father what Christ did to cleanse him from his failures and mistakes. Jesus said when He washed His disciples' feet, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with me." Jesus has washed his father, forgiving his father's doubts by going to the cross. The water reminds him of his baptism where God cleansed him with the same forgiveness on the cross. There God prepared him to serve others. The risen Christ every day comes with those scarred wounded hands to continue to forgive him and strengthen him for every trouble and problem he faced. That was why Jesus said, "Follow Me" for He was his father's forgiveness, hope and strength.

The boy and his father continued to have many conversations about Jesus and how Jesus got him through tough times. The son was amazed about what it meant to be a godly man, a Christian. It did not mean he wouldn't have difficulties. It did not mean he was weak because he couldn't endure on his own. It meant Christ was his forgiveness, hope and strength when those times came. For his father was smart enough to know when those times came, the greatest ally he had was Christ. For the son, the words, "Follow Me" reminded him that Christ was his forgiveness, hope and strength. It was an invite for the same joy his father had.

Christ says to us, "Follow Me" so that He would be our forgiveness, hope and strength. As we go to Him with the Spirit's power, in prayer, we watch Him come to us with those scarred hands to wash our feet; reminding us we are baptized and forgiven of our sins. He then listens to us, so we can arise with the strength He gives us to continue to follow Him. Amen. In Christ, Pastor Abatelli
