# A Message from Pastor Bruner

The June Messenger is sponsored by Mike & Jamie Blue in thanksgiving for their family.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Suppose God gave you a small cup, and He promised to fill your small cup so that you can fill other containers. Imagine a pattern that repeats over and over. God fills your cup and you pour what you have received into other containers until your cup is empty.... God refills your cup, and you pour it all out again until empty. It sounds like... tiring work.

Now consider that our soul is the "cup" being filled with what God provides. God fills us by the Means of Grace (the Word of God and the Sacraments). When we care for others and share the Gospel with them, we share what God has placed within us. In a world in need of help and hope, our "cup" can become empty very quickly as we pour out these heavenly resources. If we rely upon one worship service per week to be refilled, then we will go through much of the week empty (or else we will hold back what we have and not share generously). This is not what God wants.

I know from experience what it is like to pour out my cup until I have nothing left. As part of my responsibilities as pastor, it is easy to spend a lot of time in the Bible in order to share it with others but fail to have my own cup remain filled. The solution has become clear to me. The only way we will be able to share without becoming empty is if we keep our "cups" level and let God overfill our hearts with His Grace-filled Word. We have heard this in Psalm 23:5b; "my cup overflows." This is why I am inviting each one of us to begin or continue personal devotions so we can enjoy a lifetime of fullness.

God wants to fill our "cup" every day so that it **spills out**. Instead of being filled up only on a Saturday or Sunday, God wants to fill us up whenever we spend time in His Word. In order to share what God has given us and not run out, the solution is to daily spend time reading and meditating on God's Word.

Many people want to spend time in the Word of God, but they fight the time factor. That is why I am providing small steps at first. As a child learns to take longer and stronger steps, we will also grow up into bigger steps. I am suggesting everyone use the daily lectionary which can easily be read and meditated upon in 5 - 15 minutes.

The first steps will be short and comfortable. Eventually, we will become more agile and experienced on this journey. Our confidence will grow as well as the desire to go farther than we ever thought we could or would. Don't let the bigger steps scare you from starting with the small steps. See the next page for more explanation about this spiritual journey based in the Word of God.

# JUNE 2013 -- DAILY LECTIONARY LSB pp. 299-304; with Psalm selections from: A Year with the Church Fathers

Following historic practice, this lectionary presents a continuous reading through the books of the Bible, often associating certain books with particular sea-sons of the Church Year. The goal is not to read through the entire Bible each year. Rather, two readings of 15-25 verses each are provided for each day one from the Old Testament, the other from the New Testament. Under this plan, nearly all of the New Testament and approximately one-third of the Old Testament are read each year. Please note the following:

- The lectionary begins with Ash Wednesday. During the seasons of Lent and Easter—the movable seasons in the Church Year—the Church Year calendar is followed.
  - Following Holy Trinity Sunday, the calendar year is followed. The calendar readings are continued until the beginning of Lent in the following year.
    - Occasionally a third, optional reading is listed in italic type. This reading covers materials that would otherwise be omitted from the daily readings. Sometimes it provides parallel readings, for example, from the minor prophets.

#### Step 1

Read more about the Daily Lectionary on page 299 in the Lutheran Service Book or reprinted in this issue of the Messenger with this month's reading schedule.

To help you gain insight from the readings, use the acronym I.T.C.P. Each letter stands for Instruction, Thanksgiving, Confession, and Prayer. Read the Bible and ask what does God want to teach or **Instruct** you through this passage? For what can you give **Thanks** to God based on this text? What can you **Confess** based on this text? Now **Pray** based upon this Scripture reading.

#### Step 2

Utilize the prayer topics for each day as provided on page 294 in the Lutheran Service Book hymnal or ask the office how to get a tri-fold card of this resource.

#### Step 3

Purchase The Lutheran Study Bible and enjoy the many excellent learning aides included.

Try keeping a journal or taking notes of what God teaches you each day and your prayers.

Join a Bible study group (Sunday mornings, small group home study, or a future weekday Bible study to be offered) for additional insights and even helpful encouragement to continue on your journey.

There are many different reading schedules available to guide you through the Bible. You can go through the entire Bible in one year or two years, or "chronologically." You could also read the pericope lessons (Old Testament, Epistle, and Gospel) used in the worship service ahead of time. The following pattern enables you to read it two times each week (O.T. on Mon. and Thurs., Epistle Tues. and Fri, Gospel Wed. and Sat.). There are also many online reading schedules like one found at www.Sanctus.org.

Experiment with what works for you. The goal is to have your cup filled each day and for God's grace to spill out through you into other people's cups. Yes, personal devotions and Bible study will involve time in our daily schedule, but it will become a time of abundant restoration (overfills) rather than something that exhausts us (empties). This is not tiring work but a joyful process of lifelong spiritual growth.
