# A Message from Pastor Bruner

#### **LUTHERANS FOR LIFE**

Is Abortion Allowed In Cases Of Rape? By Jean Garton Date: February 8, 2008

The Child of Rape: Place two newborn babies side by side on a table. Call together medical specialists, scientific professionals, social engineers, and leading theologians. Have technicians measure the size of the babies, examine their bodies, observe their behavior, draw blood, and perform reaction tests of all sorts. Then let the experts tell us which baby is the product of rape. They can't! The child of rape, as every child, is a work of art created by God. Isaiah 64:8 speaks of God as the potter who fashions clay into something beautiful. In Psalm 139 the comparison is even more exact that it is God himself who weaves our bodies together in our mother's womb.

The Godless Act of Rape: Rape, long considered a sexual act, is now recognized as an act of violence, control, and rage. Those emotions are all exhibited in the rape of Tamar by her half-brother, Amnon, and the ravished Tamar rightly calls the rape a "godless act" (2 Samuel 13:12). The outrage of society today against such a "godless act" is to demand vengeance. Someone ought to pay! Ironically, it is often the innocent child who, through abortion, receives a sentence of death. Abortion may serve the emotional needs of a society repelled by rape, but it doesn't serve the needs of the two human beings most effected—the mother and her unborn child.

Abortion vs. Love: Abortion, as a supposed "solution," is usually offered out of pity for the violated victim. Pity, of course, is a good thing in that it is the feeling through which a person shares in the suffering and wounded condition of another. Yet, love is greater than pity! Pity sees the raped woman in her desolation and shame. Love sees her desolation and shame but also sees the woman in relation to the God who redeemed her through the sacrifice of His Son, Jesus. Love sees the value God places on unborn life and knows that He has a plan for both mother and child. In 2 Kings 14:6 we are reminded of the Lord's command, "Parents must never be put to death for the crimes of their children, and children must never be put to death for the crimes of their parents." To impose capital punishment, in the form of abortion, on the innocent child is to do what God expressly forbids. It is to repeat the "godlessness" inherent in rape. Unlike the rape in which the woman is an innocent victim, in abortion she becomes an accomplice in an act that destroys an innocent, defenseless child. The fact that the mother was in no way responsible for the act that led to the child's conception does not remove the child's right to life. The truly compassionate, loving solution is one that is both non-violent and life-giving. Positive, sensitive, and caring counseling that encourages the nurture and protection of the other innocent victim of rape or incest—the unborn child—can be part of the healing process.

(Next month – Is abortion allowed in case of Incest?)

Closure of Flint abortion business is answer to prayers: Prayers have been answered with the closure of the Feminine Health Care Clinic in Flint. This closure continues the remarkable trend of abortion clinic closures in Michigan during the last 2 years. Since November of 2011, there have been 10 Michigan abortion clinics which have closed their doors. There are now 28 freestanding abortion clinics in Michigan. Since 1987, the number of abortion businesses in Michigan has dropped from 72 to 28, and the number of abortions performed in Michigan has dropped 52.7 percent. Please continue to pray that God's love would be real for those facing untimely pregnancies and that all mothers would choose life for their babies.

Abortion is forever – get the facts first.

What Luther Says: (462 Christ's First Advent Necessarily Lowly, His Second Not ) If this birth had been announces to the nobility of this world and the shepherds had compared themselves with these men of influence and their wisdom and wealth, it would have been frightening to them. For men fear power and stand in awe of wisdom. If Christ had come with trumpets and had had a cradle of gold, His birth would have been a splendid affair. But it would not be comforting to me. He was rather to lie in the lap of a poor maiden and be considered of little consequence in the eyes of the world. Now I can come to Him. So He now reveals Himself to the miserable in order **not** to create the impression that He is coming with great power, pomp, wisdom and aristocratic behavior. But upon His return on that Day, when He will come against the high and mighty, it will be different. Now He comes to the poor, who need a Savior; **but then** He will come as a Judge against those who are persecuting Him here.<sup>1</sup>
