A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Despite the many snow days this past winter, our children will be out of school this month. What will they learn this summer? Ephesians 5:4 says, "Fathers, do not exasperate (provoke to anger) your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord."

Imagine years from now, a young person doing something because of what you taught them today. Will their actions or words be something that makes you happy and proud?

The hardest lesson for me as a parent is realizing my bad behavior today will most likely be copied by my daughters years from now. How I treat my wife and children today will affect their view of marriage and parenting in the future. What I am not proud of - but continue to do - is likely to be repeated by my children.

Recently, I told a couple that I appreciate coming to church to receive the Sacrament of the Altar. I often reflect on my failures as a husband and father. Receiving God's forgiveness helps soothe the guilt and shame because God says it is removed.

My intention is not to add a burden to our lives, but remind us that God offers much to guide us and even set us free from what does burden us. I encourage us to gain the wisdom and strength that God offers through His Word. Supper regularly. Talk with your family about the good things we can do with our lives and how important it is to avoid the not so good things. Admit your mistakes. Discuss what has happened and ask for their forgiveness (as well as give for-giveness back when appropriate).

Examine how He treats each of us and imitate this behavior. Learning is never over. Happy Father's Day to all you fathers. A God blessed summer to all, as we continue to gather for worship and Bible study. This is how we continue to learn more from God and receive forgiveness for our mistakes.

LUTHERANS FOR LIFE If They Say....You Say....

A prolifer's guide to talking about abortion with people who are in favor of legal abortion.

Longing to go back to Egypt, they are unwilling to endure current hardship. They also reject Moses' leadership, have little faith in divine promises, and even get caught up in worshiping other godsWhereas Israel failed miserably in the wilderness due to their constant complaints and unbelief, Jesus overcame temptation in the wilderness by relying on God's word. (Mt 4:1-11; Luke 4:1-13).				

PROVERBS – While there are few passages in Proverbs that expressly point forward to the coming Messiah, several speak of God's Wisdom in terms that point to the second person of the Trinity and have been understood this way since the earliest Christian writers. Prov 3:13-20 first introduces Wisdom personified as a woman (taking advantage of the grammatical gender [feminine noun] of the word *Chokmah*. In this passage, Wisdom's attributes, value, and benefits are praised. At the very end, however, Wisdom is portrayed as more than simply a personification. She is the instrument through which Yahweh created the world (Prov 3:19-20; cf. John 1:1-3).

Proverbs is a collection of God-revealed wisdom sayings from Israel's kingdom period. ... Much of the book concerns the believer's life in this world as a walk with God who calls them from their sinful ways and shows them how to live according to his will. Nevertheless, Proverbs also focuses on God's grace in saving repentant sinners through the work of his Son, who is God's eternal wisdom.

JOSHUA – Joshua often depicts God as fighting for Israel. Of particular interest in this regard is the appearance of the Commander of Yahweh's army to Joshua just before the conquest of Jericho (Josh 5:13-15). The text gives a couple of indications that this is not simply an angel, such as the archangel Michael, who is sometimes called a commander.

... The Commander allows Joshua to worship him, something God's holy angels would never allow, but is acceptable and appropriate for God himself. Thus, this commander is God. This appearance of God as Commander, therefore, ought to be understood as a manifestation of the pre-incarnate Christ. Not only is Christ depicted in Scripture as the Leader of the heavenly armies (Rev 19:11-16), but also it is only through Jesus that people see the Father (John 1:18; 14:9 and Col 1:15).
