



#### If they say...<u>No one knows when life begins.</u> You say...

If no one knew when a distinct human being comes into existence or if the unborn are alive, wouldn't that actually be a good reason to make abortion illegal? Because if we're not sure if the unborn are living human beings, then don't women having abortions take the risk of possibly signing the death sentence of a living human being?

Before buildings are imploded, those destroying the building make sure there are no humans inside or in the near vicinity. A person who claims it's okay to have an abortion because no one knows when life begins is like a structural engineer thinking it's okay to implode a building before making sure no one is in it. If we're not sure the unborn are alive, then we shouldn't destroy them until we're 100% positive they're not. This is why in the first few days after September 11, workers clearing the wreckage of the World Trade Center used their hands and buckets and not bulldozers because there was the possibility there could be living human beings underneath.

January 22, 1973, is the date when the U.S. Supreme Court handed down the Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton decisions making abortion legal in every state through all nine months of pregnancy.

to the patriarchs; as he says, "I will never break my covenant with you." Yahweh's love is irrevocable and so he is Israel's Savior. ---- Judges 2:11 -- 3:9 plines his people (Judg 2:14); Crying out is Israel's only hope (Judg 3:9); and Deliverance, Yahweh raises up judges to save his people (Judg 2:16). Tragically, this sequence repeats itself over and over again. The only solution is God's gift of the monarchy. This becomes the main theme in 1 and 2 Samuel preserve his people by answering their cries of distress and providing for their salvation. God could not rescind Israel's election because of his promises JUDGES: The book of Judges is not a memorial to Israel's heroes of yesteryear as much as it is a testimony to Yahweh's gracious resolve to is the theological center of the book. The skillful literary weaving together of the events of Israel's history is designed to show the readers that their God is gracious despite human failings, joyful when humans in 2 Samuel.
