A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In February, the temperature in Millington was <u>above</u> freezing (32 degrees F) only three times. One weather forecast site shows that it will be <u>below</u> freezing only six times in March. This will be a welcome change if it is true. A minor furnace repair at home made me appreciate the blessings of heat and a safe dwelling place during bitter winter weather that God provides my family.

The scripture for the 14th day of "Walking in the Word"* was from Proverbs 3:27-28. "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it. Do not say to your neighbor, 'Go, and come again, tomorrow I will give it'—when you have it with you." Being aware of this verse and several families in our church and community that have needed help with their heat has made me reflect on what God is saying. One of the meditative thoughts was, "How can I be an instrument of God to provide for the spiritual and physical needs of others?"

During these extreme frigid temperatures, the obvious answer is to help anyone who is in need of heat. This can be done through the Millington Ministerial Alliance Emergency Fund and our church's Board of Social Concerns.

The other necessity of our neighbor is spiritual. Regardless of the temperature, it is important to share how God has shown His love for everyone's most desperate need through Jesus. It pleases God when we are personally engaged in the ministry of our church to do this, as well as when we share regular gifts to accomplish the same. These direct and indirect actions are how we are helping our neighbor.

I am delighted to hear from members who are utilizing the "Walking in the Word" Scriptures and meditative thoughts. This tool is helping us grow in our faith and understanding of God's love for each of us, as well as inspire us to show God's love to others.
