## $\mathcal{A}$ Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In February, the temperature in Millington was above freezing ( 32 degrees $F$ ) only three times. One weather forecast site shows that it will be below freezing only six times in March. This will be a welcome change if it is true. A minor furnace repair at home made me appreciate the blessings of heat and a safe dwelling place during bitter winter weather that God provides my family.

The scripture for the $14^{\text {th }}$ day of "Walking in the Word"* was from Proverbs 3:27-28. "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it. Do not say to your neighbor, 'Go, and come again, tomorrow I will give it'-when you have it with you." Being aware of this verse and several families in our church and community that have needed help with their heat has made me reflect on what God is saying. One of the meditative thoughts was, "How can I be an instrument of God to provide for the spiritual and physical needs of others?"

During these extreme frigid temperatures, the obvious answer is to help anyone who is in need of heat. This can be done through the Millington Ministerial Alliance Emergency Fund and our church's Board of Social Concerns.

The other necessity of our neighbor is spiritual. Regardless of the temperature, it is important to share how God has shown His love for everyone's most desperate need through Jesus. It pleases God when we are personally engaged in the ministry of our church to do this, as well as when we share regular gifts to accomplish the same. These direct and indirect actions are how we are helping our neighbor.

benefit of His people, the disciples would prove unable to accept such suffering. Jesus stresses the prophetic nature of His death by saying, "It is necessary ..." His death is not
accidental, nor even a vicious injustice. It is the eternal plan of God (Eph 1:4-5). Jesus repeats this prediction twice in Mark (9:31, 10: $33-34$ ), so that there ends up being
three Passion predictions, one for each of Peter's denials in $\quad 14: 66-72$. After each Passion prediction, Jesus continues by teaching about discipleship. elders ... chief
priests ... scribes. Jesus' rejection was by the breadth of Israel's leadership rather than one misguided segment. three days rise again. This will be the ultimate sign, pre-
figured by Jonah (Mt 16:4), which will demonstrate His power as the Christ. His merciful, sacrificial love places Him on the cross. From that death, Jesus rises as the saving
Christ, bestowing the benefit of His death on all.
MK 8:35 whoever would save his life. The mystery of Jesus' suffering for the life of the world turns upside down everything the disciples know and imagine. In order to save their lives, they must be willing to give them up. The chief priests and scribes will mock Him on the cross saying, "He saved others; he cannot save himself" (15:31). The sacrifice of His life saves all who have entrusted their lives to His death and resurrection.

10:32 on the road going up to Jerusalem. This is the metaphorical road seen since 1:2-3, the straight path prepared by John which leads to the cross. Jesus was walking ahead of them. Jesus knew exactly where this would lead, to His death and resurrection. He walks ahead of the disciples, a shepherd leading the sheep, into the valley of the enemies (cf. Jn 7:1-5); they expected a deadly confrontation in which they would die along with Jesus (cf. Jn 11:16). But this Shepherd will sacrifice Himself, protect the sheep, and astonish the world with His resurrection.
