From: *A Year in the OT – THE HOLY TRINITY – Meditation – “God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble”* (Ps 46:1). Even though the mountains shake, the waters foam, the earth quakes, and the walls of the fortresses of humankind crumble and fall, God is our refuge and strength. He will not let your foot slip; He will not let you stumble and fall; He is a very present help in time of trouble. Indeed, of trouble there is plenty!

It is a troubling and troublesome world in which we dwell. It is a place of quaking and shaking as nations rage and kingdoms totter. It is a place of disaster, natural and manmade. It is the place in which we dwell, and it is a place that causes us great concern. It is a troubling and troublesome world in which we dwell, but God is our refuge and our strength. He watches over and keeps us; He is our helper and protector, our God.

Who is this LORD of hosts? Who is this one called the Most High? How shall we know Him, and how is it that He regards us? He who has made us has revealed Himself to us in His Son. Our Creator and Sustainer sent His only-begotten Son so that we might know Him and rejoice in His favor. It is Christ who shows us our God, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. Jesus Christ’s sacrificial act redeems us and restores us in the eyes of the Father in order that we might have joy in His presence once again. The Son, the Resurrected One, opens our eyes and we behold with wonder the grace of God.

Through the blood of His Son, the Father sees us as His children, who have been brought through the waters as the Spirit works faith. In Him, we are children not of an earthly father but children of the Word and Spirit, children who walk by faith guided by the Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier...

In the midst of an unsettled world, in the midst of troubling times, in the midst of an uncertain future, in the midst of so much fear and so little security, God is our refuge and strength. Behold His works, look upon His mighty deeds, see His powerful presence, hear His voice, and observe His wonders. This is our God, our refuge and strength. This is our God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Be still and know that He is God; be still and be comforted that He is with us, a mighty fortress, an unshakable refuge and strength.
