A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

Summer brings many changes. Schedules change for vacations and other activities. The crops change before our eyes. The Lord has been blessing our area with favorable conditions. There are many other changes that could be mentioned, but I want to share just a few of the specific changes at St. Paul Lutheran.

Our Christian day school has seen some changes over the summer. We are sad to announce that Mrs. Rebecca Kochenderfer will not be returning as our sixth grade teacher. However, we are glad for her that she is pursuing her dream to teach in a special school in Florida. We pray God's blessings on her and her family, as well as thank God for her years of service at St. Paul Lutheran. Due to time restraints, the Board of Education recommends we fill her position with a contract teacher and pursue a called church worker for the 2016-17 school year. The 8th grade will also have a new teacher. We have good news that Mr. Paul Mueller (pronounced Miller) will be installed as our new 8th grade teacher on September 13th. We welcome into our church family the Mueller Paul, Jessica, Sophia and Xavier. Keinath is still undergoing treatment for her leukemia, so we have issued a one year contract to Mrs. Jessica Phillips, who served as a long term substitute in Kindergarten last school year. There have also been some room changes. The Kindergarten room has been moved to the classroom across from the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} grade rooms. The reading specialist will be in the old Kindergarten room. The Childcare and Pre-School have also switched rooms in order to allow the coming and going of children throughout the day in Childcare. Having the Childcare with direct access to the exterior door will minimize interruptions to the Pre-School program. The Director of Accounting has been moved across the hall from the Church Office and her old office will become the equipment room for the office.

The August Messenger is sponsored in honor of Art & Ilene Weber's 65th wedding anniversary, from their children.

With all these changes, a big thank you needs to be shouted to all who have helped with the decisions and the physical labor involved in moving.

We also have seen some change in how we approach our junior and high school youth ministry. Many volunteers have helped provide activities and ministry over the summer. Thank you to these people too. If you are interested in helping, let me know and we can find the best way to have you share in this work with our young people. Plans are to keep moving forward in the school year.

This letter has shared what has changed, but we do not change why we do what we do. Paul wrote, "[Christ] died for all so that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him who died and was raised again" (2 Cor. 5:15). We serve God because He has served us.

The letter consequently draws the line between the Church and the world, between human wisdom and the Gospel, between the wisdom of this age and the "foolish," paradoxical wisdom of God, in a way that should have shattered once for all the attempts to make Christianity a rich and interesting blend of the two. The legacy of 1 Corinthians is a perpetual reminder to the Church that she must dare to be "other" if she is to be the apostolic Church of God, that she must dare to oppose the axioms and standards of this world if she is to do her divine work in the world.

(e.g., money, pride). But the one true God does not tolerate shared allegiance. If we participate in the worship of false gods or support churches that do not faithfully confess the Gospel in all its purity, this would indicate that we assent to what those worshiping communities believe. For this reason, we all whom we meet to Christ. Our actions tell others about who we are in Christ, giving us an opportunity to witness to His love in all aspects of our lives. Christians are not forbidden from interacting with those who do not know Christ—far from it. By our actions and words among them we can testify to pp. 465-466 Application Ch 10 -- In our age, there are many gods. Some are worshiped as such (e.g., Islam, Hinduism); others subtly become gods one committed to Him and to one another. As we faithfully worship God, we are also called to build up both our fellow Christians and, ultimately, to lead avoid such false worship. At the Lord's Table, He offers His body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and through them creates a faithful community, the one God and what His Son, Jesus Christ, has done for us.
