I was angry and upset. The more I thought about this brother coming home, the more I was consumed by rage. Wanting just a moment where I could shake some sense into him.

How could he reject us like that? How could he waste my father's wealth? How could he leave us? Now the gall he had to come back home with nothing, after all he did.

How could my father just let him go? I loved him too. Why did he give so much to him? How could he take him back after all that messed up kid did?

Did my father realize that I was in pain too? Frustrated in how he could blow the wealth my father gave him. This boy deserved nothing back. I was by his side, never left. I slaved day and night for him. I did everything this father wanted.

I could not believe what this father did. He welcomed him home, ran to meet him, then acted as if this boy never left him. He showed that every wrong turn, every bridge burned was forgiven and gone. His return brought me no joy, even though I knew it should have. The injustice and pain filled me as this father threw him a party. There was no way I would go after all he did. His actions were inexcusable.

I withdrew from the party. I did not care that it hurt this father or this brother. I found myself alone in what I created for myself. I was filled with the filth of resentment and ingratitude. It turned bitter in my mouth. This was unfair, my heart ached out. How could this father be so loving to that boy who turned his back to me?

When this father came to me I gave him a few choice words, for this son of his did all those wasteful and painful actions. How could I welcome this boy back? This father never let me have a party with my friends! I never left his side!

Then, to my surprise, he said something I did not expect. As I used words to disassociate myself with this father and boy, he called me son. Was I still a son

to him? Would he welcome me back like my brother? Is that how my father was, that he did not care what happened to him? Was he loving, to the point that he would face all hardships for us? Was that love he had inside still there for me? Was it here for me even when I turned my back on the love he showed to my brother?

Yes, it was always there. Never leaving, and could never be taken away.

Our loving Father in heaven is the same way. No matter what reckless streak we have been on, no matter how resentful we are for Him welcoming the wanderers, His love remains.

Our God is a God that while we were still sinners Christ died for us Rm. 5:8. Christ paid the price on the cross so that He could see that face sin stole from Him. To see that face He was missing so much to see. He died and rose so that He could wrap His loving arms around us. So that we could be welcomed back to the place where we belong. For His love has never left us.
