# A Message from Pastor Abatelli

Thanksgiving is around the corner and I would like to share a story about a 17 year old girl, Liz, who showed that we have a lot to be thankful for. During an English class Liz was disturbed by a remark from a peer, "I do not have anything to be thankful for." Liz's mind screamed, "What?" Her stomach dropped as she thought about her mission trip to Haiti.

Not a second after arriving at Haiti she assisted the medical team. Haitians lived without luxuries we take for granted: indoor plumbing, electricity, paved roads, and air conditioning. Not having these luxuries they rarely had a chance to bathe. The smell was nearly impossible to tolerate. She found herself holding her breath kneeling down to help put shoes on barefoot Haitians. She offered simple the things: clothing, toys, shoes and laughter. There smiles never failed to remind her of similarities. Our human needs are the same. It was just that hers were met most of the time and theirs were not.

She saw many heart breaking things, but nothing touched her more than a visit a Home for the Sick and Malnourished Babies. There a Nun approached them with a small girl who shouted happily "Hello!" A closer look revealed her condition. Liz shift nervously as she followed the nun, wondering if all the children would be that unhealthy like that little girl.

Before seeing the children she heard them. The heat in the room was suffocating. Holding her breath preparing for what she might smell or see. The sight was heart wrenching. The room was lined with cribs. At first she was paralyzed with helplessness. Those in her group began smiling and talking to the infants. She quickly followed their example. Suppressing her feelings, she showered them with as much attention as she could

Suddenly, singing was heard from another part of the building and the group followed. In a dining hall, older, healthier toddlers just finished their meal and greeted them with a song, De rein, tra la la, merci merci! Translated from French, Welcome and thank you. Liz held back tears as these attention starved children hurried to them. It was simply impossible for a handful of staff to give nearly 100 children their individual focus each day. Desperate to be held and hugged, the kids tugged at their cloths.

After a little while the children were called to another room. Liz and the group started to leave and did their best to give last minute hugs and smiles. Leaving, Liz saw a baby girl in a rocking chair holding out her arms, crying, wanting to be held. Liz picked her up and she stopped crying instantly. That girl rested her head on Liz's shoulder and Liz spoke softly to her, words of Jesus. She offered the simplest thing the child wanted... human contact and love.

Overcome with hopelessness thinking of all the children. She felt spoiled as she thought of the life she would return to. She realized it is a gift from God to be born into the family she had. Before leaving she gave a fistful of money, whatever little bit could help. God has shown mercy to her by giving her the life she has, that she wanted; no needed to give anything and everything she could to these little ones in return.

A month before Christmas, in her classroom of students

who had been shelter from the realty of how many people lived poorly in the world. She thought, If only they knew how much we have and take for granted, maybe they'd be more grateful. Liz shook her head sadly and raising her hand, "I like to tell the class about my trip."

If only we knew how much we have and how much we take for granted maybe we can show our gratitude. God has blessed us; we have a lot to be thankful for... a lot of things: clothing, shoes, food, human care/contact, but also the greatest gift of Christ, Him dying for the world sins and rising to life

We have a great gift of Christ's love and care to share with others. We could speak softly in their ears as Liz did to that girl of God's great love in Jesus who died and rose. We can show this love and thankfulness for Christ by our actions. Liz gave money to show her thankfulness for God's love and abundance of blessings- luxuries she had. She also offered the simplest expression of thankfulness that those kids needed-human contact. Those who are poor don't have those gifts we take for granted: a hug or hearing of Jesus. We have so much to be thankful for, physical luxuries that many don't have, and the spiritual blessings that Christ gave us in His death and rising to life. We cannot help but have the want, no the need to share these gifts with others. We have an abundance of blessings lets share them including sharing Christ to all.

**Rv 21:1-8 in Devotion**: The climax of this book and indeed all of history at last comes clear: the restored heaven and earth is presented to God's resurrected people. Such a magnificent future and hope calls us to rise above the ugliness and sin of this fallen world, because impenitence and a lack of vigilance can still lead to the shipwreck of our souls. At the same time, God is faithful, and so will unfailingly fulfill the purposes for which His Son became man; He will remove the curse that so sorely afflicts us.

**Rv 22:1-5 in Devotion**: John describes our life in heaven as having no hunger, darkness, loneliness, or pain, but rather eternal joy in the presence of the one true God. How, then, can so many people fail to see the blessedness Jesus has laid out for us along the straight and narrow way that shortly leads to unceasing bliss? In many cases, the answer is simply that people do not appreciate the greatness of God's grace and the magnificence of the glory that awaits the faithful. Inspired by God's Word and preserved by His Spirit, however, we may already rejoice with those who have gone before us.

**Rv 22:6-21 in Devotion**: Because John's message is about the ultimate triumph of good over evil, it is always relevant, and all the more as the world slides further into chaos and corruption. On one level, Revelation powerfully confirms what we already fear, i.e., our world and everyone in it is doomed. More profoundly, however, this book is about transcendent hope. It shows how infinitely greater God is than evil. By offering a vision of the new creation soon to be revealed, Revelation draws us on toward our blessed hope in Christ. To Him be power and glory throughout the ages! **Prayer**: Blessed Redeemer, help us to keep these holy words and thereby conquer sin, death, and the devil. May we, along with Your whole Church on earth and heaven, continue praying with full confidence and a joyful expectation, "Come, Lord Jesus! Come quickly!" Amen.

### LEAP News, Finance Report, Misc.

LEAP Takes An Important Organizational Step

The Lutheran Education Advancement Plan (LEAP) implementation team make significant organizational improvements with the adoption of a constitution and by-laws forming the LEAP Alliance. This is a critical development as LEAP takes on more complex challenges. The Alliance constitution and by-laws were written with the expectation that LEAP will ultimately become a Recognized Service Organization of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. They were also written with the anticipation the LEAP will continue to use task forces to complete much of its work. Copies of the LEAP Alliance constitution and by-laws are available from LEAP congregational representatives or by contacting LEAP strategic implementation team chairperson Bill Hoeseman.

One area in which the opportunity for collaboration among ministries is Information Technology (IT). A recent survey revealed several opportunities for partnerships as approximately 40% of LEAP ministries "outsource" their IT support. Another 40% rely on volunteers some of whom are seeking a place to share ideas and seek advice. Both circumstances present LEAP with the opportunity to strengthen our ministries.


One task force is in the early stages of exploring the possibility of "growing" MOPS (Mothers of Pre-Schoolers) programs which have a great deal of success in several LEAP ministries. Although MOPS is not directly related to Lutheran schools, they offer young families support and spiritual nurturing - a purpose very consistent with Lutheran schools.

As LEAP transitions to a new organizational model, it is an important time to reassess its progress and future. To that end, David Near, the consultant who led the original study resulting in LEAP, has been contracted to facilitate this important "next step" discussion. His work coupled with the new organizational model will build LEAP's capacity to address more complex issues.

Regardless the organizational model LEAP's vision will remain steady – "To advance Lutheran education for future generations across the Great Lakes Bay Region."

Our **school theme** this year is "**Gratitude**" based on Colossians 2:6-7.


