### "Keeping the Command, Keeping the Promise"

In the last chapter of Matthew, Christ commanded us to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." He also promised in those passages, "I will be with you always, even to the end of the age."

For 118 years, St. Paul Lutheran Church and School has baptized and taught what Christ commanded to countless adults and children in the Millington area. By their investment of time, talent, and treasure in the Gospel, our ancestors promised future generations that the teachings of Jesus Christ would continue for generations to come. That was their vision and drive. It was their hope that their children, grandchildren, and others would be taught everything that Christ commanded.

It is with this same commitment to OUR future generations that we at St. Paul are launching our "Keeping the Command, Keeping the Promise" campaign to raise needed funds to offset the cost of Christian education at St. Paul Lutheran. We as a congregation must keep the command of our Lord to preach and teach the Gospel. We as a congregation must keep the promise of our ancestors to provide a place for Christian education and growth as we remember Christ's promise to us that He will be with us always, even to the end of the age.

Our congregation through our offerings has underwritten the cost of a Christian education for both members and non-members alike for generations. Now, we are at a critical time in our congregation's history. We have a deficit that can no longer be absorbed by our own funds. Our Board of Stewardship is diligently working on a stewardship program to help us become more aware of the problem and our responsibilities in solving it out of love for our Lord and what He has done for us. An Ad Hoc Committee for Deficit Reduction was formed after passage of our latest deficit budget. It has been tasked with developing ideas for increasing revenue and decreasing expenses to help in reducing the deficit.

One of the projects the Ad Hoc Committee is pursuing is a community wide auction of new or like new donated items as a way of increasing revenue. This auction will take place April 30, 2016. We are asking our membership for prayer to make the auction a success, for their time in volunteering to help with running the auction, and for donations of goods or services that could be used for auction. **WHAT DOES REDEMPTION HAVE TO DO WITH BODILY LIFE?**There is a tendency to either idolize the body or ignore it. On the one hand, our culture glorifies the search for the perfect body—youthful, fit, attractive and healthy. On the other hand, there are ehicists who lament an "excessively physicalist approach," ... arguing instead that emphasis should be placed on such intangible dimensions as freedom of personal expression and the quality of relationship. Neither of these extremes are consistent with the Christian faith, for the Son of God took on human flesh and blood to redeem us in body and soul. The body is created, redeemed and hallowed by God, Who destines it for the resurrection. The words that the pastor speaks at the grave actually tell us much about life: "May God the Father, who created this body, may God the Son, who by Holy Baptism sanctified this body to be His temple, keep these remains to the day of the resurrection of all flesh."

God's Son has a body. In the womb of Mary, Jesus was conceived by the Spirit and grew as an embryo through the nine months of gestation to birth. By His incarnation, He has hallowed life in the womb. Redemption is not merely a spiritual transaction. It was accomplished by Christ Jesus in His flesh and blood. So the Catechism reminds us that Jesus Christ, true God begotten of the Father from all eternity and true man, born of the Virgin Mary "has redeemed me a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and His innocent suffering and death."

Bought with a price, our bodies are not our own. This is the point Paul uses to clinch the case against sexual immorality: "You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body" (1 Co 6:19b-20). You do not belong to yourself, and that is good news. The Second Article of the Creed, just like the First Article, shows us that autonomy is a lie! In contrast to the beguiling temptation to be autonomous, a temptation that only drags us down to despair, entangling us in a life which is ultimately dead-ended, the Catechism promises something far more liberating and expansive. It promises life in Jesus, who is bodily risen from the grave. He has redeemed our bodies and souls "that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true." And because it is most certainly true, all empty promises of autonomy are unmasked for what they really are—lies from the father of lies.

Study question: What does the Incarnation have to do with the way we treat life in the body at all stages?

### LEAP News, Memorials, Finance Report

LEAP Takes An Important Organizational Step

The Lutheran Education Advancement Plan (LEAP) implementation team made significant organizational improvements with the adoption of a constitution and by-laws forming the LEAP Alliance. This is a critical development as LEAP takes on more complex challenges. The Alliance constitution and by-laws were written with the expectation that LEAP will ultimately become a Recognized Service Organization of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. They were also written with the anticipation that LEAP will continue to use task forces to complete much of its work. Copies of the LEAP Alliance constitution and by-laws are available from LEAP congregational representatives or by contacting LEAP strategic implementation team chairperson Bill Hoeseman.

One area in which the opportunity for collaboration among ministries is Information Technology (IT). A recent survey revealed several opportunities for partnerships as approximately 40% of LEAP ministries "outsource" their IT support. Another 40% rely on volunteers - some of whom are seeking a place to share ideas and seek advice. Both circumstances present LEAP with the opportunity to strengthen our ministries.

One task force is in the early stages of exploring the possibility of "growing" MOPS (Mothers of Pre-Schoolers) programs which have a great deal of success in several LEAP ministries. Although MOPS is not directly related to Lutheran schools, they offer young families support and spiritual nurturing - a purpose very consistent with Lutheran schools.

As LEAP transitions to a new organizational model, it is an important time to reassess its progress and future. To that end, David Near, the consultant who led the original study resulting in LEAP, has been contracted to facilitate this important "next step" discussion. His work coupled with the new organizational model will build LEAP's capacity to address more complex issues.

Regardless the organizational model, LEAP's vision will remain steady — "To advance Lutheran education for future generations across the Great Lakes Bay Region."


