A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Followers of Jesus Christ,

By the time you read this article, it should be announced what God's will is for my ministry. Whatever the decision, I want to be a "Christian" who is following Jesus Christ and submitting to His will. I pray He will use me, and each of you, to accomplish His will.

The name "Christian" means a "follower of Christ." The name implies every Christian is willing to submit his/her will to that of Jesus Christ. As I shared in my sermon from Acts 16 on May 1st, the Apostle Paul *followed* Jesus and shared the Gospel somewhere different than he planned, while Lydia *followed* Jesus by staying where she was and assisting the ministry of the Gospel as God enabled her. In other words, they were willing to be where God wanted them and to do what God wanted them to do. My prayer is that each of us will follow Jesus and know where and how He wants us to serve.

We are daily tempted not to be engaged in the mission Jesus gives to His Church. Whose will are we following: our own will or the will of Jesus? The answer is obvious.

A glimpse into God's will is this....God wants:

- ◆ "all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim. 2:4).
- ◆ to "prosper you and not to harm you... to give you hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11).

- ◆ His followers to "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thess. 5:16-18).
- ◆ us to "Love each other as I have loved you" (John 15:12).

Jesus invites us to follow Him into the Church, so we can receive what He does for us through His gifts of Word and Sacrament. As a result, we will praise Him together as forgiven and redeemed people (1 Pet. 2:9-10) and then go out to the harvest field of souls to share it with them.

Whether I am here or elsewhere, I want to be an instrument of God to share the Gospel and His blessings. I believe this is God's will for me... and for you... as we follow Jesus.

Gospel on the Feast of Ss. Philip & James, Apostles – John 14 [1:1-14] pp. 404-407.

What does Christ deal with in this Gospel? – Three things: first, He comforts His disciples against the cross to come, guaranteeing them heavenly dwellings with the Father; second, when they are in doubt about the way, He informs them that He is the Way to the Father; third, He promises to give them everything from the Father that they ask in His name.

How would Christ prepare the place? – By His suffering and death. It is as though He was saying, “The battle will first pertain to Myself. After that, you and all Christians, which are My people and belong under My banner, must battle and fight. For no one will be crowned unless he fights valiantly. Though you are not all complete in faith, fervent in love, strong in tribulation, rich in virtues, and upright in good works, you need not be afraid therefore. ...I must first go ahead and prepare the way for you, and remove all hindrances, purge away the great murderous spirits and devourers of souls, the devil, death, and hell, abolish the reign of sin and death, and make the way clear, that you may have a free, safe path to the Father.”

How could Christ say that they knew the way, and yet Thomas say that they did not know the way? Were Christ and Thomas not in agreement? – Thomas and the other disciples were well aware that Christ had often told them of His suffering to come. They even confessed that Christ is the Son of God, but this confession was still somewhat weak, not yet confirmed by the Holy Spirit nor tested by cross and suffering. Therefore unbelief and lack of understanding of Scripture still clung to them.

What is Christ's intention with this saying, “I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life.”? – With this He intends to draw the disciples and all Christians from all false, erring ways, from all false doctrines, factions, and sects, and from all that may hinder us with respect to eternal life. In other words, He is saying, “Dear children, if you stray from Me, you will never find the way to eternal life, even if you search until you die. Not only am I the Way, I am also the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through Me alone. No one comes to the Truth and the Life except through Me. There is, in short, no other way, path, bridge, ship, or gate to heaven except Me, no other doctrine or life except in Me. I am the beginning, middle, and ending. Only do not let false ways lead you, nor false doctrines hinder, halt, or turn you back, but keep going forward and stay on the straight road, in My Word of truth, and you will not miss eternal life. If you know Me, you would know my Father also. And from now on you know Him, and have seen Him.”
