Vacancy Plan Report

Thank you to all who have helped complete several pieces of our self-study. There are two steps left before we can get the results. A final interview, with the Church Council, will be completed July 5th. Last of all, some historical information and other data about our congregation needs to be gathered. Any members who enjoy history of our community and church, as well as statistics, are welcome to help us with this task. After all this information has been assembled, then we will wait for the report to be compiled. The final report will enable us to analyze what we are doing well and what needs to be given more attention as we serve in this specific commu-The call process and/or other staffing needs will nitv. be guided by the analysis we make from the report we receive.

Progress so far:

- 1. We finished our four week survey of the worship services to get a demographic of who we are serving each week.
- 2. We have provided surveys for communicant members to complete and return for processing. These will help identify the view our members have of the ministry taking place through St. Paul Lutheran.
- 3. Thirty members, who are engaged in the ministry of St. Paul through some type of small group, completed an additional and focused survey.
- 4. Our Congregational Mission and Ministry Facilitator, from the Michigan District, interviewed the leadership, faculty and staff.

This self-study process will take some time and effort, but in the long run it will help us to identify areas of ministry that we can seek to improve. Please keep praying for God's guidance and encourage one another to become engaged in the ministry God has given us to enjoy as a church. This is a great opportunity for members to consider how they can live out their role as a part of the body of Christ here at St. Paul Lutheran.

Bookkeeper's Corner / Financial Report / Memorials

The Bookkeeper's Corner

Gee whiz – a new fiscal year is upon us. It's hard to believe. Voter's passed a deficit budget at the June 11^{th} Voter's meeting – but – it's only (\$2,172). After much discussion, it was felt this small deficit would be easily overcome by church givings.

While I cannot provide you end-of-year numbers for our church books (something about meeting Stacey's deadline for the Messenger), I wanted to share our numbers through May, 2017. There has been some concern circulating about the accuracy of our numbers and I want to set your mind at ease – here they are (verified by our Treasurer):

a) Our church general ledger, which includes all recorded assets, liabilities, income and expense totals \$2,428,412.47. Yes – a big number and it balances to the penny.

b) Our **surplus** in the general budget for FY 16/17 is \$27,356.99. We've tightened our belts and it shows – pat yourselves on the back.

c) Our overall deficit started at (\$77,968.18). We ended at (\$50,611.19). Perseverance.

Note: Our deficit numbers as reported to you have had some discrepancy. There is indeed a \$104 difference that evades us, but we know where it's at! It's important to know that our overall bookkeeping numbers **balance to the penny;** it's the deficit <u>reporting</u> that is off by \$104.

The financial books are open to any congregational member. Stop by any Tuesday or Thursday and I'll be happy to address any concern you may have.

Electronic Giving Update

Many folks like the idea of on-line giving – it's a very disciplined approach in giving your first fruits to the Lord as He commands. You don't have to remember your envelope that you left on the kitchen counter, either.

At the same time, many folks do not want to give an entity the authority to tap into their bank accounts - I get that - I'm one of them.

Here are some factoids about on-line giving here at St. Paul to consider:

- The bookkeeper is the only one that handles your personal information.
- Your application that contains your personal information is triple locked in the bookkeeping office.
- You can make a change at any time; just call or stop by – a real person whose first language is English and lives in the United States will help you.

On-line giving forms are available in the wall organizer outside of the bookkeeping office.

For those that are already enrolled: The FY 17/18 budget was based on your suggested pledge offering. If you made changes to your pledge, you need to update your on-line giving forms or nothing will be changed.
