## A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Are you ready for some honesty and yet positive information?

A recent chapel speaker reminded us that Christians will face persecution. However, we have it so much easier here in America than Christians in other countries. We can openly gather to practice and even publicly share our faith. We are blessed with a school that teaches Jesus. We are blessed to have a church that has three worship services to attend. We have Bibles and Catechisms and devotion books and Christian radio stations, etc. We are not arrested in the middle of the night, beaten and then jailed. We are not disowned by family just because we believe in Christ. We have not been killed for following the teachings of Jesus.

Honestly, we may be facing unusual weather for this time of the year, but our circumstance due to weather is a far cry from what the southern coastal states have been experiencing.

Is everything perfect at St. Paul? No, but we have so much for which to thank God. We have a decrease in enrollment, but about half of these were due to families moving out of the area. On the other hand, we have 35 children in our Preschool for ages 3 and 4 years old. That is 10 more than last year. We are in the black for this fiscal year even though our worship attendance is down. The steps we have taken to trim our budget and work together with families, who want to be responsible in supporting this Christian education, have been productive. Our Grant-parent Fund has been supported and also successful in providing assistance for children to attend our school. Principal Schoenknecht is leading by pointing us to Jesus and our faculty and staff want to be here.

The summer months are hard to get extra things accomplished, but now we are getting traction again. The Self-Study documents are completed and have been delivered to the District Office for processing. After we get the report back, we can begin discussing how to focus on important ministry areas and the staffing needs required. This will help us identify what we need for the pastoral care provided and other potential ministry areas.

Whether it is the vacancy or some other reason, I am discouraged that members do not come to worship or serve in the various opportunities we have. I care for their soul but I am not reaching everyone's heart for one reason or another. We have so much potential to serve God and one another. We are seeing this in many places, and some members are helping; one such area is with visitation of our fellow members in the hospitals, care facilities and private homes. The potential for St. Paul Lutheran members to touch other lives is amazing. I know of other members who do this in their own personal way apart from a specific church program. That is great.

We are five years from having our mortgage paid off. That is going to be here before we know it. WOW!

Yes, there will be setbacks in every congregation, but God continues to lift and carry us. Our hearts have a "guh-zillion" reasons to give God thanks with a bunch of praise on top of that. The Reformation that turned the church back to the honesty of God's Word is reason to rejoice. God loves all of us self-centered, stubborn, broken sinners enough to make us perfect and without flaws in His eyes through the redemption accomplished by Jesus our Lord. That is honest and positive.

## The Bookkeeper's Corner

Hard to believe the summer is over, school has started, and Starbucks is offering their Pumpkin Spice Lattes. The Christmas lattes will be out before you know it.

But, back to summer for a moment. Every August the church participates in its biggest fundraiser(s) for the school - the Fish Booth and Hot Dog booth at the Millington Old Fashioned Festival. So, how did we do?

Fish Booth. This fundraiser is hosted by our PTL for future projects in the school. Although PTL received gross revenues in excess of \$17,000, the expenses and sales taxes were also pretty gross. (Get the pun?) Expenses and taxes were around \$6,700 and the Old Fashioned Festival folks took another 20%: in the end PTL realized \$8,109.70 profit. A LOT of work from many people to pull this off.

**Hot Dog Booth.** The 8<sup>th</sup> grade class that participated in the recent September Washington DC trip hosted this booth. They received \$4,500 in revenue and after expenses, fees, and taxes, they walked away with \$2,298.26 which was applied to their trip.

**5K Run.** The 8<sup>th</sup> grade class also hosted a 5K run at the Millington Rail Trail. Although they received \$488 in revenue, the fees left them with \$126.33 realized profit that was also applied to their trip.

While fundraising has monetary benefits, the bigger benefit is the fellowship among the workers and the demonstrated servanthood that others witness. You never know where a seed is planted.

## **Thrivent Action Teams**

Did you know that if you're a Thrivent member, you can apply for a \$250 gift card to help with a service activity or fundraiser? Think of all the possibilities here at St. Paul where this could be beneficial.

#### **How it Works**

Think about an unmet need in our church or community and how you could help. Apply to lead your volunteer team in a one-time fundraiser, service activity or educational event that can be completed within 90 days. Once your project is approved, you'll receive a Thrivent Action Kit, including:

- Thrivent Action Team T-shirts.
- A \$250 Community Impact Card you can use as seed money to get your project off the ground and make a bigger impact. Details and guidelines can be found online.

#### How often am I eligible?

All Thrivent members are eligible to lead a Thrivent Action Team. However, the number of teams each member can lead per year depends on his or her membership type. Benefit members are eligible to lead two Thrivent Action Teams per calendar year, and associate members are eligible to lead one per calendar year (maximum of three).

## **New Funeral Policy**

We realize it hurts when a loved one dies.

In an effort to serve our members during their time of grief, we have established a new policy. We want to share God's love with them through the funeral/memorial service. We will convey God's promise of eternal life for any person who believes in Jesus as their Savior.

Our pastor(s) are now available to provide a funeral/ memorial in the church or at the funeral home for a member, or non-member, of St. Paul Lutheran Church who died with this Christian faith. Please contact the pastor or office so we can coordinate the necessary arrangements and related fees.

The St. Paul Dorcas Funeral Committee also wants to show compassion to the family during this time of grief. They can provide a luncheon for members of St. Paul Lutheran Church. However, due to limited people resources we are able to provide this luncheon for members only. They have a set menu, but can serve other food that is provided. If a family wants additional items, the family can arrange to have these prepared and delivered to the kitchen and the Dorcas can serve these items as well.

When a meal is desired for someone who was not a member, the family can make arrangements to have a luncheon in the parish hall with a caterer. Again, please contact the church office to make necessary arrangements.

## Pastor Appreciation Month



Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give your-selves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. 1 Corinthians 15:58

Your pastors work hard. If you're tempted to think that most of the hours they're on the clock are Saturdays or Sundays, consider how many hours they spend organizing, counseling, leading, administrating, teaching, planning, preparing, and much more. October is Pastor Appreciation Month. This is the time of year to go beyond saying, "Nice sermon," or "Thanks for being there." This is the month when you can go out of your way to pour into them through thoughtful gifts and meaningful expressions.

Here are some ideas on how to appreciate your pastor and church staff:

- A Gift Card Goes a Long Way. Most people who work for churches live on tight budgets. A gift card to a local restaurant or their favorite store can be a huge encouragement.
- Those Extra Tickets Mean a Lot. Do you have season tickets to a sporting event, concert, or theater? If so, consider offering your tickets so your pastor and their family can enjoy the event.
- Make Your Family Cabin or Condo Available. If you have a family cabin or cottage, consider giving your pastor a week to use it each year. This can provide a much-needed respite and time for the family to be together.
- **Don't Shy From Giving Cash**. A meaningful note of thanks accompanied by some cash can be such an encouragement and provide much needed groceries or a fun family night.
- **Pre-Pay for a Handy Man Service.** In serving so many needs, a pastor's home can soon become a collection of *I'll-get-to-it-later* projects. Several hours of pre-paid service can be a huge blessing.
- Send a Note of Encouragement. This may seem like a small gift, but can be just what your pastor needs. Even Pastors need a pick me up once in awhile.
- Take Your Pastor's Car to be Detailed and while you're at it, top off the gas tank.
- Give the Pastor a Date Night. Cover the cost of dinner or a movie. Provide childcare. Make it a getaway.
- **Dedicate Time to Pray for Your Pastor Each Week.** Let them know what you are specifically praying, and remember to keep appreciating them throughout the year.

While Pastor Appreciation Month concludes at the end of October, your pastor continues to work hard every month of the year. Surprise them with notes, gift cards to their favorite restaurants, or stores throughout the year.
