#### A Message from Pastor Bruner

"Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good....His love endures forever." Ps. 136:1

Gathering together to give thanks is important, but there is also a blessing connected to this activity.

Consider a few examples:

What a wonderful time we had celebrating the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Reformation. On October 15<sup>th</sup>, close to 13,000 people from across the state gathered in the Breslin Center in Lansing. The vocal and instrumental music was extra special. Although we hear the central theme every week, we were reminded, in a special way, that we are saved by Grace alone through Faith alone in Jesus Christ alone. God provides this good news through the Scripture Alone. Two weeks later, we gathered here at St. Paul Lutheran to continue celebrating the anniversary. We heard more special music and another message centered in Christ, Grace, Faith and Scripture alone. Both of these celebrations were opportunities that gave God thanks and unleashed blessings into the lives of those who attended.

Every so often we get a glimpse of heaven on earth. One day we will surround God's throne and lift our voices in praise for all he has done for us. Revelation 7:9 says, "After this I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: 'Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb."" Perhaps you have been in a large crowd and experienced the energy of the people there for the celebration. This passage shares that heaven will have times like this. Think about it. God invites and even commands that we gather together, so that we can get a foretaste of heaven.

One reason for gathering is to hear God speak His love to us as individuals. There is a second purpose, and that is the benefit we receive from being together. Imagine a sporting event where only a few people are in the stands. Their team wins, and the small group of fans cheer. I believe you can picture the difference between a small band of fans versus a packed house cheering in victory. It does not change the "win," but the larger crowd lifts up the spirits of those who are there for their team. What am I saying? The energy is contagious. You and I are blessed, and we become a blessing to others, when we are gathered together praising Jesus for His victory over sin, death and the devil. God designed us to need each other. When there are only of few of us praising God, it can be discouraging. It doesn't change the fact that Jesus has won. However, it is a different experience when we are surrounded by many others praising Jesus together.

What is the point? Worship attendance can be contagious. When we see a full house, we can be inspired. When we see a thin crowd, we may consider not coming back. I hope that you will encourage others to come and *Give thanks to the Lord for He is good. His love endures forever.* Don't be tempted to stop coming, because you don't see a packed house. Instead, pass on the great news of the victory Jesus has accomplished and invite them to join the celebration every opportunity we have. We have the ability to help others by simply being here.

### **Bookkeeper's Corner / Financial Report / Memorials**

#### The Bookkeeper's Corner

Question of the week: "*Why on earth does it take 7-10 days to get a check created and signed"*? It all boils down to accountability.

Our bookkeeping procedures follow GAAP (General Accepted Accounting Principles) developed by the FASB (Financial Accounting Standards Board). Further restrictions are placed on non-profit entities primarily because of the tax-exemption status. We are under a microscope to not only the IRS but the State of Michigan, Michigan District of LCMS, and most importantly – you, the congregation.

The result of this scrutiny is we verify our income and expenses **twice**. There is always more than one person counting deposits. Each Board verifies and approves payments for invoices or reimbursements. This takes times given our practices are generally carried out by folks elected by the congregation – not employees.

As an example, here's the practice to make a purchase:

- a) A Board wants to purchase 10 widgets.
- b) Board member contacts me to determine if the mon-
- ey is available if they're unsure.

c) If yes, a purchase order is created then signed by the Board member. *This obligates church funds.* 

- d) The Board purchases the widgets.
- e) The invoice arrives; it is scanned and electronically sent to the Board for payment approval.

f) Approved invoice is returned; checks are generated on Thursdays, countersigned over the weekend, and available the following Tuesday.

This may seem redundant to some, but accountability of church funds is critical. No payments are made without the appropriate documentation.

The entire process can be accelerated by **planning ahead.** If you know you are going to spend money on XYZ – don't wait until the last minute to request a purchase order or make arrangements for purchase. See me if you have questions or concerns!
