A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The world is a dark place. It is not dark just from the lack of light. Do you understand what I mean when I say we can also feel this darkness? By "darkness" I am referring to the sad and disturbing events we see, hear about and even feel in our hearts each day.

Thankfully, God has sent light into this darkness. More than sending a bright light, God has come into this darkness to shed light on what brings true life. "In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it... The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world" (John 1:4-5, 9). "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full" (John 10:10b). We know that Jesus came at Christmas as the Light of the world, but sadly mankind prefers the darkness.

"This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but men loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil. Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that his deeds will be exposed. But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what he has done has been done through God' (John 3:19-21).

Over two thousand years ago, Jesus came to bring hope and peace to a world that was also very dark. He came to shed light on our sins, and then show us how much He loves us by taking away the punishment for our sin. That is why we celebrate Him as our Savior.

Soon, many of us will use lights to decorate and get in the festive mood. Hopefully, all the lights we see will be a reminder of the one true Light that came into the world on the first Christmas.

Christians do more than just celebrate when Jesus first came. We also prepare for His second coming. The Light will shine even brighter when Jesus finally returns. That is the reason for Advent. We acknowledge the darkness in the world and in each of our hearts. Then, we prepare for the wonderful return of our Savior and Mighty King. Through God's love and forgiveness, we see a brighter future.

This Advent we will explore the theme of "Hope in the Darkness." I look forward to seeing you every weekend and also for our midweek Advent services at 4:00 p.m.
