A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Fellow Servants,

February is associated with expressing love for others. If we look around St. Paul Lutheran, we can see the expression of love, not just in February, but throughout the year.

Every week we say, "We are God's servants, saved by grace...." There *are* many humble servants at St. Paul expressing their love for God and for others in various ways. Bookkeeper's Corner / Memorials

The Bookkeeper's Corner

Let's do a comparison of our general fund between December 2016 and December 2017 – this will give you a good idea of how our funds have been stewarded:

December 2016

Calendar year-to-date surplus: \$65,829.34 Overall church deficit: (\$12,138.84)

December 2017

Calendar year-to-date surplus: \$104,919.49

Overall church surplus: \$43,216.42

What has caused this swing? The biggest factor is we are only paying for one pastor. Had we had a second pastor, we probably wouldn't have an overall church surplus. Maybe.

The second contributing factor is our planned accounts receivable with school tuition payments. With few exceptions, parents have met their pledges on time and on a regular basis. How great is that?

Lastly, end of year contributions are always higher as members are calculating tax implications with and without extra contributions. We are so blessed to be the recipient of these extra gifts.

Now for the future: we will see an interim pastor to assist Pastor Bruner until we are able to issue a Divine Call for an associate pastor. While the associate pastor wage and benefits won't affect the FY 17-18 budget, the interim pastor wages will — it wasn't budgeted. Guest preacher fees were in the budget, but those funds are just about expended.

What does this mean? If we continue to receive an average of \$53,000/month in love offerings and \$8,000/month in tuition payments, we will chip away at our surplus by about \$25,000/month (wages and benefits alone is a \$73,000/month ticket item). It won't take long for that surplus door to swing back the other way.

We're getting ready to enter the FY 18-19 budget cycle – these are things to think about. "God owns everything and we get to manage it for Him".

Memorials Updates

The Memorials Committee made some much needed updates in 2017. You may notice changes in our financial reports from the 2016 Annual Report compared to the 2017 Annual Report. We have streamlined the Memorials to better steward funds to meet the needs of both the church and school.

There are now four types of Memorials people may designate funds to: Church General Fund, School General Fund, Building Fund, and Undesignated. By restricting donations to one of these four groups, we are able to meet more needs throughout the church. Any board or church member can request funds from the Memorial Undesignated account and the committee will evaluate the need, then process the necessary paperwork. As an example: we recently found an altar chalice with a crack. Altar vessels are not a budget item, so the General Fund was not an avenue that could be tapped for the money. The Board of Elders submitted a request to Memorials to purchase a new chalice and matching ciborium for around \$1,300. We had the funds and we now have a new set of vessels.

Specific needs of the church can be met through Memorials by placing the funds in the Undesignated and then placing a request from Memorials to have that need fulfilled.

Lutheran Education Advancement Plan Advancing Lutheran Education for Future Generations Across the Great Lakes Bay Region

Story from "LEAP"...February 2018...
...PASTORS AND SCHOOL PRINCIPALS MEET TOGETHER REGULARLY

In 2011, representatives of our area Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod churches and schools began to engage in strategic planning for what would eventually become the "Lutheran Education Advancement Plan - LEAP Alliance." Already in those days, one of many objectives for building an alliance was to bring pastors and school principals together on a regular basis to collaborate on matters of shared ministry. Late in 2013, the first such "P2 Pastors and Principals Meeting" occurred. Such "LEAP P2 Meetings" are still occurring, three times each year.

Mrs. Jennifer Enge, Principal of St. John (Amelith) Lutheran School in Bay City, has been and continues to be the coordinator for the "LEAP P2 meetings" which are held at our various LEAP church/school sites, including churches that do not presently operate parish schools. The meetings often provide opportunities for touring the church and school sites and hearing the stories of ministry actions that occur there. At the "P2 Meetings," primary meeting attention is given to hearing and discussing interesting and timely meeting topics. Examples have been "Children's Church," "TEAM Ministry," "Being a Lutheran in a Post-Churched Culture," "Funding Options," and many more.

While pastors have conferenced together often for many years, and school principals have done the same, the "LEAP P2" pastor-principal meetings have proven to be beneficial and appreciated. Pastors and principals have shared resources and ideas as a result of the "P2 meetings." There have been best practice question-and-answer-conversations leading to learning what various congregations and schools are doing to meet needs and to respond to challenges. It has even been beneficial for our church/school leaders to learn once again that many of the challenges they face are rather universal. We pray God's continued blessing upon the "LEAP P2 Meetings"!

Lent

This year's Lenten Theme: "Thy Will Be Done"

"Not as I will, but as you will," Jesus prayed to His Father the night before He went to the cross for our salvation. That is our prayer as well this Lent, as we seek to do God's will in our lives. Take time to draw near to the observance of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection during Holy Week. Each service will focus on a different aspect of God's will at work among us.

A prayer booklet with a daily verse and prayer is available for use during the forty days of Lent. We hope everyone will use these daily prayers. The booklet can be used independent of the worship services, but we do hope that you will attend as many of the worship services as possible.

Biblical characters are used as insightful reference points each midweek to guide us in following our Lord more nearly day by day. The message each Wednesday will be in the form of a monolog shared by a Biblical character. There will be a time to reflect on the message and even discuss the lesson presented, for those who desire. We hope to make available online, the monolog and reflection questions for those who are unable to attend each Wednesday. The Sunday messages will be in a normal sermon format and address the common challenges of living according to God's will.
