A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A long time ago, Adam and Eve were in the garden and life was going well. That is when the devil deceived them and successfully introduced conflict and destruction into the world. The first marriage, team and family in the world became divided. This is the devil's will. He has not stopped since then. We continue to experience his work among us, as he looks for ways to damage more relationships.

I have conversed with numerous people who are each facing a variety of personal challenges. These everyday frustrations are part of life in a fallen world. The Apostle Peter writes, "Resist [the devil], standing firm in the faith, because you know that your brothers throughout the world are undergoing the same kind of sufferings" (1 Peter 5:9). We are not facing anything unusual, but that does not make it any easier.

The devil is also attacking us as the Church. That should not surprise us. "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Ephesians 6:12). How easily we forget that the devil is continuously working against us, and he wants us to look at each other as the enemy.

It is not the garden of Eden, but life has been going better for St. Paul Lutheran. However, when we work together as God's people, it appears that the devil works even harder. Sadly, he is also able to work through us, when we let him deceive us. I urge everyone to be aware of the devil's desire to divide and discourage us.

During Lent, we observe how Jesus was focused on his task to be our Savior. We can also see how the devil stirred up opposition and conflict for Jesus. Thankfully, Jesus did not get distracted, nor did he give up. It was not easy being perfect and then taking the "fall" for the imperfect world He came to save. He still loved us enough to follow through with His work.

Our focus and what we do is guided by this phrase, "It is still all about Jesus." None of us is perfect, but we serve a perfect God, who can take our humble service and use it for His glory. I have been praying a lot that God would help each of us serve together and help our relationships grow (instead of dissolve). When the devil spreads the spirit of discouragement, I urge you to look to the victory Jesus had over the devil. I also urge you to pray for God to give you the strength to continue serving in Jesus' name. "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men... it is the Lord Christ you are serving" (Col. 3:23, 24b).

Thankfully, Jesus was obedient and defeated the devil for us. When we rely on Jesus and not our own effort, we also overcome the devil. That is why, "It's still all about Jesus."



The Bookkeeper's Corner

The budget cycle is upon us. This is how it works:

1) At the February Council meeting, each board chairman is presented a budget document to complete.


+++NOTE: The budget is for the **general fund** only – we do not budget designated funds, memorial funds, or school operating costs. ++++

- 2) During the month of February, boards are evaluating their income and expense lines and presenting the budget director their numbers for the budget cycle.
- 3) In March, the budget director presents the council with a revised budget document. It is ALWAYS a deficit number. At this point, each board chairman is sent back to their boards to refine their numbers. New numbers again presented to the budget director.
- 4) This iteration process goes on several times between March and May. The goal is to present the Voter's with either a balanced or surplus budget number at the June assembly. Deficit spending is not an option.

So how do those designated funds receive money? The designated funds are reliant on special givings by you, the member. At any time, you can add a special offering for any of the designated funds. I'm often asked which funds are getting low – here are a few to consider:

- Family Help helps with any type of heating bill
- VBS it's coming up in just a few months!
- Chancel new or repair of paraments, veils, etc.
- Church workers (in-house) helps St Paul members that work in the church field with tuition
- Emergency Aid sudden expenses for the school children
- Library new books/software

Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love on another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law. Rom 13:8
