A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As you read this, consider the saying, "You catch more flies with honey than vinegar."

I recently heard someone talking about two images: what the Church is against and what the Church is for. This contrast stuck with me. Many people have an idea of what the Christian Church is against. We stand against many different false teachings, agendas, and sinful behaviors. In today's world, many Christians appear to be known only by what they oppose. We do need to speak against what is wrong. The Apostle Paul told Timothy, "Watch your life and doctrine closely..." (1 Tim. "All Scripture is God-breathed and 4:16) is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness." (2 Tim. 3:16)

But...what about the reverse? "What is the Church for?" In other words, what do we desire in life?

Here is a short list of what the Church is for: unconditional love (Rom. 5:8, 1 John 4:7-12), strong traditional families (Gen. 1:28, 2:23-24; Eph. 6:1-4), being a servant to others as Jesus was (John 13:1-17), helping others in need (Matt. 25:35-36; James 1:27), hope (Rom. 8:18-28, 35-39), restoration and renewal of relationships (Matt. 18:15; Philemon 15-16), life to the full on earth and eternal life for everyone (John 10:10; 1 Tim. 2:4), praising God for what He has done (Luke 17:17-18; 1 Pet. 2:9-10), gathering together regularly to receive blessings from God and to praise Him. (Acts 2:42-47; 1 Cor. 11:23-26), growing in grace and knowledge (2 Pet. 3:17-18). The list goes on and on.

The Church (ie. Christian people) desire what God wants. God began with a perfect world and He wants that perfection for us once again. God is against sin and the fallen conditions of this world, but more importantly He is FOR the life we have not yet experienced. He wants to restore our broken relationships and bring us to a new life that only He can bring. As Christians, yes we do use God's Word to know what is wrong, and we warn others about what is to be avoided. We cannot neglect that truth, but join me in helping people also see and hear the positive things that the Church is for. Jesus came to bring us life; new and better. Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Bookkeeper's Corner / Memorials / Financial Info.

The Bookkeeper's Corner

There have been many questions regarding memorial giving and how those memorials are distributed. Let me see if I can clarify.

There are two distinct ways to give a memorial offering in memory or in honor of a loved one.

Memorials at the time of a Funeral. When a family member or friend passes away, most of the time an envelope is filled out either at a funeral home or at the church. The envelope has four categories where the gift may be directed:

- a) Church general fund
- b) School general fund
- c) Building fund
- d) Memorials (undesignated or general)

These are the <u>only</u> four categories used. Our Memorial chairman, Sharon Keinath, wrote an article in January's Messenger explaining the distribution of all the Memorials.

If a memorial envelope is NOT marked (they are often left blank), the funds are automatically directed to the church general fund.

Memorials when an estate is settled. When a family designates St. Paul as the beneficiary of funds in an *estate disbursement* **and** the estate does not specifically state how the funds are to be disbursed, the funds are *automatically* invested through our Trust and Investment (T & I) Committee. Once these funds are handed over to T & I, the funds are **not** available for use. It is **invested**. We receive interest checks from those investments. The interest monies are managed by the T & I Committee and are available for projects by applying to T & I.

Both the Memorial and the T & I Committees steward funds received in the best interest of the church. If you have questions or wish to contribute a memorial privately, come see me in the bookkeeping office.

Did you know?

You can have your church offerings electronically deposited from your account. Simply complete the **"Excel in Giving"** enrollment form specifying the amounts and frequency of payments. Forms can be found outside the Bookkeeper office. Call the church office if questions.

Valley Lutheran to Mark 40th Anniversary of McCarty Road Location Move-in Date

Saginaw Township, Michigan – Valley Lutheran High School is hosting a special chapel service on **Monday**, **April 23, at 10am**, to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the day students, faculty, and staff moved into the McCarty Road location.

The community is invited to take part as Pastor **Gil McDonald**, who served at Valley from 1978 to 1991, will offer the message for the service. McDonald taught theology; assisted with the school newspaper, student council, and drama; and coached volleyball and cross country. After Valley, he served at Lutheran High School Northwest in Rochester Hills until 2016.

In Valley's early years, students sat on the carpeted gymnasium floor during chapel services. Students will recreate those memories during the service.

Before its current location, 82 students crammed into the basement of Faith Lutheran Church on Bay Road (now Coleman Temple).

"They were looking for an excellent Christian high school education," said Executive Director **Dr. John Brandt**. "Seven faculty members led by Principal David Krause met those expectations. The new Lutheran high school was a reality."
