Sat., June 23rd & Sun., June 24th



What is Puppen fur Christus?

It is German, meaning Puppets for Christ. They are a group of performing puppeteers. They spread the Word of God through puppet presentations of skits and songs.

Their Mission is to share the Word of God, the Love of our Lord Jesus Christ, and His Saving Grace through puppet entertainment. They present the message of the saving Gospel of Christ through skit and song.

The ministry team started in October 1981, with five teen puppeteers and two adults. They decided to call themselves "Puppen for Christus" after their German heritage. They have made over 1200 presentations to over 250,000 people during the past 33 years. They share the very important message of God's Love and Salvation.

The Bookkeeper's Corner

It's June and from the bookkeeper perspective, this is a busy time of the year.

During the month of June, we close out all outstanding school accounts. Any unpaid accounts have two paths: the family cannot register for the 18/19 school year until all debts are paid, or if the family no longer has children in the school and the debt is still outstanding, we make arrangements to send their account to collections.

On June 30th, the midnight oil is burning making adjusting entries to the books and ensuring the general fund is set back to "zero" for the next fiscal year. This is how we tell if we end the year in the black or red. Unless the train falls completely off the tracks between now and June 30th, it looks like we're going to be in the black for not only the fiscal year, but for all time. Let's see what happens!

Speaking of fiscal year, the Board of Finance has been discussing the value of a mid-fiscal year versus a calendar fiscal year. For 99.9% of everyone reading this column, **when** we close our books is transparent. With the exception of the budget, everything we do is based on calendar year: W-2s, 1099s, annual report, payroll taxes, insurance premiums, and a litany of other things. After speaking with other churches, a CPA, and Michigan District, whether a fiscal year is mid-year or calendar year is of no consequence to anyone but ourselves. Let's make things simpler.

Moving to a calendar fiscal year will mean two budget cycles this year **only**. The budget we will approve for 18/19 will be brought to voters at the June assembly. We will begin a calendar fiscal year budget cycle in September for calendar year 2019. Since the 18/19 budget will have been approved, we already have the first 6 months of 2019 done. We will just need to budget for the remaining six months of 2019. We only do this once (two budget cycles in one year).

This has been a fruitful year. Each board has taken stewardship of their funds seriously - we don't spend money we don't have and we're now seeing the fruits of our labor. As we continue marching toward surplus funds, we look to the Gospel of Luke 14:28: Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it?"


