A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It has gone by quickly. The Lord has brought us through a year of selfexamination and preparation for the next chapter in the life of St. Paul Lutheran in Millington. We have completed a self-study that provided a picture of a ministry plan for us to pursue. Family Life is the term that we are using to describe how we want to reach every age group of our congregational family, from their first breath to the last, and build bridges between the members. The reason for these bridges is so that all of our members are receiving the message of God's love in Christ Jesus and also sharing this same message. The transmitting of this love can and should pass across these "family ties" or connection points.

St. Paul Lutheran passes on the bountiful love of God through the preaching of God's Word, Baptism and the Lord's Supper. There are many within our church who desire to receive this love during the divine service on a weekend but also during the week in homes, hospitals, and other care facilities. Not only will another pastor help our present needs, but there are plenty of opportunities for reaching more of our existing members, as well as future members. We pray that the will of God will be accomplished as He guides Rev. Martinal to accept or decline the divine call issued to him through St. Paul Lutheran.

Sharing God's love can come through you also. That is why we want members to be engaged in passing on God's love. This can

be done through many of the existing ministries of St. Paul or through something yet to be developed. It is important for each of us to understand, as well, how we can also transmit God's love through our daily vocations (spouse, parent, child, co-worker, employee, manager, neighbor, etc.). How are you developing and utilizing connections or bridges with other people? Your faith in Jesus is important and can be shared easily (or simply caught) in the relationships you have each day.

The Apostle Paul wrote, "And we pray this in order that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God." Col. 1:10

Our hope is that in the years to come, we will grow in our knowledge and bearing of fruit. This new chapter will tell how the love from (and for) Jesus was passed back and forth among the people at St. Paul and also to those outside of the church. Why? So that God will unite us all through Christ Jesus into one family. "If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from His love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose." *Phil. 2:1-2*

How You Can Help:

This is important, so that you and those in our community that participate do not feel guilted into giving at what we are advertising as FREE.

After the car wash, we will send you a letter with your gift amount (which is also your receipt for charitable giving) with a pre-addressed envelope. Simply drop it in the mail, along with a check for the pledged amount made to St. Paul.

Given we're not at the end of the fiscal year yet (June 30th), I don't have yearly totals to give you. But, it looks like we'll end in the black for the fiscal year and have a **deficit** for all years. May and June were lean in terms of tithina.

So did the school hold up their end? Remember that all tuition received for K-8 and net profit from ChildCare/ Latchkey/Preschool make up the school contribution to the General Fund. As of this writing, we have.....let me find the list of outstanding debt.....oh wait - there is no list! We have received 100% of all accounts receivable from the school for this fiscal year.

At the June Voter's Assembly, voters passed a surplus budget for the next fiscal year. Here's a snapshot:

LEAP

All praise to God for the fact that the schools of our "LEAP Alliance," have been, and continue to be distinctively Christ-centered! What a blessing! Might it also be said of our Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod schools of the Great Lakes Bay Region (our "LEAP schools") that they are measurably excellent in many significant respects? Read on, please.

For several decades now, there has been in place a school excellence goal-setting measurement stick, nationally, for our LCMS Lutheran schools. That tool, now very well-developed and highly acclaimed, is known as "National Lutheran School Accreditation." This voluntary, rigorous, very thorough and well-developed program provides means by which those who own/operate/lead Lutheran schools may aim for high levels of excellence within their schools. Through the process, a school which becomes accredited will invariably. . . a) improve . . . b) be measured against high national standards for Lutheran schools . . . c) be evaluated against its own unique purposes . . . and d) receive recognition for successful completion of the process.

Note the following: Among the 793 Lutheran Church -Missouri Synod elementary schools nationally, 501 of these schools (63%) are accredited through "National Lutheran School Accreditation." And among the 86 Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod high schools nationally, 61 of these schools are accredited through "NLSA."

Now get this: Among the 18 Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod elementary schools of "LEAP here in the Great Lakes Bay Region of Michigan, all 18 (100%) have worked hard for, and have earned National Lutheran Schools Accreditation! And the one LCMS high school in the GLBR of Michigan (Valley Lutheran High School) has also worked hard for, and has earned accreditation through NLSA!

New Funeral Policy and Form

MEMBER/NON-MEMBER FUNERAL POLICY

The purpose of this congregation is to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ as taught in the Bible and is witnessed in the Lutheran Confessions. We would never want to minimize the importance of being an active member of a Christian Congregation, however we do not want to forsake our members when they must face the death of a loved one. It is truth; the funeral is not for the dead, but for the living. We Christians must comfort one another with the faith of Jesus when we suffer sorrow over the death of a loved one. Because of this the pastor and the elders have established the following policy regarding non-member funerals.

- 1. We will conduct the funeral services of any Christian who has asked to be served by our pastors, who desire the comfort of our Christian ministry, and who have no church home.
- 2. We will conduct the funeral services of any Christian who is a close relative of our member (parent, child, sibling and spouse) who has no church home and on the basis of paragraphs #3 and following.
- 3. Non-member funerals will be conducted at the funeral home or church at the request of the family. Members of LCMS Churches may have their funeral at St Paul Lutheran.
- 4. We would be unable to conduct the funeral of an active lodge member because of the contrary witness of the lodge ritual to that doctrine which we confess.
- 5. Ex-lodge members who have become inactive may be buried by our church, but there can be no participation either before or after the funeral by the lodge chaplain and their ritual, or any other reference to lodge membership.
- 6. For the family member who was unknown by the pastor as to the profession of Christian faith, a member of his/her family must be able to attest to the deceased's personal belief that Jesus Christ is God's Son and the Savior of all repentant sinners. This is necessary in order for the pastor to conduct the service on the only basis he has: comfort can be offered only through the power of Jesus' promise to redeem mankind through His blood and give them who believe eternal life.
- 7. Anyone wishing to present a special situation that is contrary to this policy must submit that request to the Board of Elders for consideration.

Again, please contact the church office to make necessary arrangements and handle the non-member fees for use of the facility and ministry team.
