## **A Message from Pastor Martinal**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It's that season again. No, I'm not talking about hunting season. I'm referring to budgeting season, at least here at St. Paul, and hopefully soon in your own homes as you look ahead to 2019. This process can be scary, frustrating, and stressful. Nevertheless, it is necessary. So when it comes to budgets, income, and giving, what are we to do and think? When you find yourself chanting ever louder, "Budgets and income and giving, oh my!", like a traveler on the yellow brick road in the land of Oz, how are you to cope?!

First and foremost, we remember our Heavenly Father provides for our spiritual needs. On account of the sacrifice of our Lord Jesus Christ, we have the forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and everlasting salvation delivered to us with absolute certainty that it is ours as sons and daughters<sup>1</sup>. And since we are sons and daughters, we are heirs who share in the glory of the Son of God. The inheritance is ours because of the Father's grace and mercy.

This is why we give generously of our income to the work of the Church. We want to imitate our Heavenly Father's generosity by being generous ourselves. We give to the work of the Church because we have witnessed and experienced the generous giving of our Heavenly Father.

Second, our Heavenly Father's gifts are more than just spiritual; they are earthly as well. As we pray in the Lord's Prayer: "Give us this day our daily bread". Our Father gives us everything we need for the care of both body and soul<sup>2</sup>. His generosity knows no bounds!

A major way our Heavenly Father provides for our "daily bread" is through the various vocations in which He has placed us. One aspect of our vocations is the generation of income. As God's stewards we are called to be faithful and wise in handling and using our income. Money is an integral part of our lives. We need to spend the necessary amount of time to comprehend how it affects our material and spiritual lives. The number of Bible references on the subject speaks to its importance. How we view and handle money often causes barriers to our spiritual growth and personal stewardship.

Thus, Christian money management begins with the conviction that we want to become faithful and good managers of money entrusted to us by God. God owns everything: we are simply stewards acting on His behalf. This is true not only of all that we have in this life<sup>3</sup>, but also all that we are in this life<sup>4</sup>. The rest flows from there. Since we are stewards of what belongs to God, entrusted to make use of it according to His will, there is an expectation of responsibility and accountability. For the Lord said, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked" (Luke 12:48b). And from this comes blessing and reward: "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come share your master's happiness!" (Matthew 25:21).

Therefore, we sit down at the beginning of the year, the beginning of the month, or the beginning of the week to set aside a generous portion of God's daily bread for His work in the Church. We don't do this simply because He has commanded us to do so; it is because we, as His children by grace, want to mimic His generosity in our own lives.

He is our Father; we are His children. It's not just about keeping the lights on in the church building; but about shining the Light of Christ in this place, in our community, and throughout the world as the Church, the Body of Christ. It's not just about another physical building project; but about a spiritual building project<sup>5</sup>.

Remember, we have a God who is real and present. A God who meets us where we are. A God who calls and sends real people – us! – as His Body to work and serve in the world. A God who blesses us and gives us everything we need in order to work and serve in the world.

Let us then, as His own sons and daughters, press all that our Heavenly Father gives us into the service of His Church and to His glory.

You are created and loved by God the Father, redeemed and sent by Jesus Christ, and made holy and empowered by the Holy Spirit to be faithful stewards,

<sup>1</sup> What I am saying is that as long as an heir is underage, he is no different from a slave, although he owns the whole estate. <sup>2</sup> The heir is subject to guardians and trustees until the time set by his father. <sup>3</sup> So also, when we were underage, we were in slavery under the elemental spiritual forces of the world. <sup>4</sup> But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, <sup>5</sup> to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship. <sup>6</sup> Because you are his sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "Abba, Father." <sup>7</sup> So you are no longer a slave, but God's child; and since you are his child, God has made you also an heir.

"Give us this day our daily bread." What does this mean? God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving. What is meant by daily bread? Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.

## The Bookkeeper's Corner By Diane Mills

Last month I wrote about our upcoming budget that will be given to the voters at the December assembly to approve. I addressed why we don't set money aside for big ticket items. The budget that will soon be presented to the voters is no different than the past two years: we don't have the income to set money aside; but rather just meet our expenses.

We have several expensive projects that will need to be addressed: some sooner than later. Here's what we're looking at:

- > Parish Hall floor and adjacent hallway. If we want our facility to be a showplace, the parish hall doesn't qualify. Next time you're in the hall, take a close look at the floor. Quotes for replacing/refurbishing the floor/hallway are between \$14,000 and \$18,000.
- > Our fire alarm system is frequently in alarm status. The parts to fix the unit aren't even being made any longer, hence the reason we can't get a permanent fix. Not only does the unit need to be replaced, the alarm doesn't reach into the Sanctuary. That's sort of disconcerting. Quotes for new alarm system and extension to sanctuary are between \$7,000 and \$9,000.
- > Many of the lights in building are still incandescent. Changing them out to cost saving LEDs not only save in the short run, but they last for 10 years or more depending on use. If you've ever had to change a bulb in the sanctuary, you'll see why this is a big deal. Quotes range from \$42,000 to \$44,000 (yikes!).

Now, all this to say that we could very possibility fund some, if not all, these projects by grants. Problem has been the grants are not easy to write – they take time. If any of you reading this article have any **experience in writing grants**, or have a heart to tackle one for the first time, please let a Trustee or the Church Office know. I will provide you with any numbers required, so don't worry about that. We just need someone(s) (an ad-hoc group?) that will take the time to serve.


