A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Have you noticed it goes in cycles of early, then late. This year it started early. Christmas was being advertised and songs were played way <u>before</u> Thanksgiving. I even remember hearing something at the end of October about a Christmas sale.

Starting early is not bad if.... the message is really about the true meaning of Christmas.

The other night I listened to some beautiful Christmas music. One of the musicians commented:

"We believe the purpose in life is to be happy. And for us in our own lives that happiness has come from following the teachings of Jesus Christ, holding family extra close, and loving others more than ourselves. It's not easy but it is so worth it. And Christmas so beautifully brings all of these three things together. So go out and make someone else's Christmas season extra special by doing something anonymous for someone in need. Do whatever it is that you want to do to share the gift of Christmas."

This comment made me think, "That sounds good, but are those things what Christmas is all about?" I realized the nostalgic sounding words were heartwarming, but they sidestepped the real meaning of Christmas.

<u>I can try</u> to follow Jesus, hold my family close, and love others more than myself, but I know every year <u>I fall short</u> (no matter how early I start).

The musician was correct. Following Jesus "is not easy." Christians acknowledge that we cannot follow Jesus perfectly. That is the reason why He came to save us from our failures called sin. He came to rescue us from our sinful nature and make it possible for us to be perfect in God's eyes. There is **great peace** in knowing we are saved by

God's gift of grace through Jesus, the Christ child.

This is the pure message of Christmas. Read or sing the following verses contained in the hymn "From Heaven above to Earth I Come" (vv.2-4). An angel is speaking:

To you this night is born a child Of Mary, chosen virgin mild; This little child of lowly birth Shall be the joy of all the earth.

This is the Christ, our God most high, Who hears your sad and bitter cry; He will Himself your Savior be From all your sins to set you free.

He will on you the gifts bestow Prepared by God for all below, That in His kingdom, bright and fair, You may with us His glory share.

It is never the wrong time or too early to hear a song that reminds us of the gift we received in the person of Jesus the Christ. As you hear the various songs of the season, enjoy the silly songs, the heartwarming songs, and the songs of good cheer. Above all, I hope you will hear songs that celebrate the true gift of Christmas, so that God can bring you the real comfort and joy of Christmas.

The Bookkeeper's Corner By Diane Mills

The Calendar Year 2019 budget is complete, has been presented to the Council for approval, and now it goes to the Voter's Assembly on December 9th, for approval.

The voters will receive the detailed report, but here's a snapshot at the overall estimated income and expenses for the year:

As to be expected, Salary and Personnel has the largest expense with wages and benefits. We just received the Blue Cross increase for CY 2019, so that figure is included. Other significant changes that increased this expense: we added a child care assistant director and are expecting a new child of God in April with one of our employees.

The Boards of Evangelism, Fellowship, and Social Concern are raising their own funds through fundraisers or congregational special gifts.

We are at a surplus, albeit a small one. That means there's not much wiggle room for unanticipated expenses. If the boiler system goes out, we have a leak in the roof, or other such expenses, we'll be asking for help from the congregation to cover the expense. Hopefully we'll have an "uneventful" year.

Did You Know?

You are helping provide compassion and hope through your offerings. In addition to the ministry provided right here at St. Paul Lutheran, a portion of our offerings goes to the Michigan District of the LC-MS. One of the many mission efforts supported is Elli's House. This special place provides temporary shelter for runaway girls and/or young women caught in human trafficking, in the city of Detroit. Their primary goal is to work toward family reunification, when possible. Along with the tangible support given, workers at Elli's House reach out to these young girls with the Gospel message of Jesus' love and forgiveness for them. God is using your gifts in other places and in important ways.


