A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There is so much in store for us in this new year. It is time to put the information we received from the congregational self-study into action.

Every week we say our mission statement, "We are God's servants, saved by grace through faith, commissioned to share the Word of Christ to all." How do we put this into action? Ask yourself what it looks like for you personally to share the Word of Christ. In 2018, our vision is for everyone to see how they are part of "sharing the Word of Christ to all." There are countless ways for this to be accomplished, so let God's Spirit lead you by the Word into your own way of sharing the message of God's love.

What does it look like for a pastor who is sharing the Word of Christ? It occurs from the pulpit and in the classroom, during visits at the hospital or in a home. It occurs through prayers and conversations with others seeking God's guidance and help.

What does it look like for you? It could be in a public way or behind the scenes. You may help in the worship service or you may assist in some way that is less visible, but this is linked to sharing the Word of Christ. You may pray with your family or someone throughout the day. Sharing the Word of Christ could be without words; by simply using your hands or feet to serve others for the sake of Christ. Consider what it looks like for you to be living our mission statement.

Have you noticed that our average worship attendance is about 306 people every weekend? However, this is not the same 306 people. Compare these numbers. In October we had 559 different members in worship; in November 538 members and 407 members for the first two weeks of December. During this time period, we shared God's Word and Sacraments with

659 different members (not including visitors). What does this mean? It means that we are sharing God's Word with more people than it appears by the weekly attendance figure. Truthfully, the goal is to get all 659 members to come more often and for each of them to visualize how they can help share the Word of Christ to all. In 2018, we want every member to visualize how they are sharing the Word of Christ in one way or another. You can help us see this happen by inviting others to join us to receive God's Word and Sacraments every week. We hope to have more people hear and live the Word of Christ.

In regards to the pastoral care ministry, here is the temporary action plan. We hope to enlist the help of a pastor to serve parttime (most likely a retired pastor). During this short-term (possibly 6 months) we want to formulate a job-description for an Associate Pastor with a focus on Family Life Ministry. We want to call a pastor, who will help us learn more of how we can serve and engage our members from their first breath until their last. The philosophy or approach of Family Life Ministry will expand everyone's view of how we live as a church family and share the Word of Christ to all.

2018 A.D means the year 2,018 Anno Domini (in the year of our Lord). I encourage you to look at 2018 in the year of our Lord Jesus as "A new year with a **vision** on living the mission."

Advent Dinners

The VLHS students and the Church Choir hosted two of the Advent suppers this season. Here's how we did:

This can save your life!

Many of you are aware of Enhanced 911 - your land line phone number is associated with your address. Should you call 911, your address is automatically dispatched to first responders thereby saving critical minutes.

Because so many folks have ditched land-lines in favor of mobile devices, Emergency Operation Centers in both Tuscola and Lapeer Counties have activated a program called "Smart911." It's free. Subscriber creates an online account and fills in as much (or little) information to aid 911 operators and first responders to help them help you.

There was an actual case recently where the caller's home was engulfed in flames and was overcome by smoke inhalation. He called 911-said nothing-and emergency crews arrived in 11 minutes, knew where the bedrooms were, how to enter the home, and rescued all family members-and the dog. The caller elected to upload his house plans, pictures of the house, medical issues, and the dog's name and photo. First responders had everything.

Some may not want personal information uploaded to a secure site - that's up to you. However, if a possibility of saving your life or those of a loved one trumps an online profile, you can visit www.smart911.com and check it out.

... LEADERS AND REPRESENTATIVES OF CONGRE-GATIONS/SCHOOLS MEET AT "SCHOOL FUNDING WORKWHOPS"

Recently, the LEAP "Funding Options Committee" hosted the first in a series of three 90-minute evening workshops (called LEAP-Shops) aimed at "Building a Mission-Minded School Funding Model." Thirty-nine participants representing seventeen of our *LEAP* Lutheran churches/schools attended the October 30 LEAP-Shop at Peace Lutheran School in Saginaw. Because knowing and understanding the mission of a Lutheran school is critical to developing a "Funding Model" that is consistent with "Mission," informative interactive discussions took place at the LEAP-Shop around the subject of "The Mission of the School." The discussion dug much deeper than simply examining a particular mission statement, and it prompted each participant to critically think about how his or her own school's mission and ministry fits into an overall "Ministry Plan."

The two upcoming *LEAP*-Shops will focus on applying understanding of a school's "Mission" to the budgeting process, to tuition and financial aid, to operational efficiency, and to fundraising. These next two *LEAP*-Shops will be held on January 30, at 6:30 pm, at Faith Lutheran Church, Bay City, and on April 30, at 6:30 pm, at Peace Lutheran School, Saginaw. Perhaps you have interest in attending the *LEAP*-Shops, even if you may have been unaware of, or unable to attend the first *LEAP*-Shop in the series of three.
