



Specifically, it may be time to consider taking a leadership role within the congregation. We currently have vacancies on the Board of Stewardship and Board of Evangelism. As well, in the fall we will be gathering names to ask people to consider running for election to a board within the congregation. In addition, the office of President will also be open.

If you are interested in considering any position within the congregation, please contact a pastor or Jeff Yorke. Any of these people can speak to you regarding the roles of leadership you may be able to provide.

How Are Missions Gifts Divided?

Last year, the Voters' Assembly decided to change the look of our envelopes to include only three lines. What this did was create a single line for Missions, which includes contributions to District, TIM, Valley Lutheran and Special ministries. This change did not come without long thought and discussion.

With this change, a decision had to be made on how to divide the missions line in a way that reflects the giving of our church. Members of the Board of Stewardship presented to Church Council a proposal to do this, which the Church Council approved. It takes an approximate percentage average of how gifts were given over the past three years to each of these areas. This was the percentage presented to Church Council that was approved.

When a person contributes to the mission line, 55% of all contributions will go to District, 35% of contributions will go to TIM, and 10% will go to Valley Lutheran. Again, this reflects the percentages that had been given the previous three years before the envelope change.

We ask that givers do not write an individual line for "Valley Lutheran" or "TIM", for example. It is thought that your cheerful giving to those areas will be reflected as gifts are divided as above. If someone wishes to make absolutely sure their gifts are given to an area of missions, and they write a specific area on the envelope, we will make sure that the gift will be given as a part of that percentage.

Praise the Lord! Please pray that our Lord will supply the fund continually for this important ministry.

Thank you so much for your patience and understanding when personal letters do not reach you frequently. You still pray and support us. We are going to write to acknowledge your gifts, cards, letters and contributions soon. May our Lord bless you and yours richly for you so love Him and are faithful to His work! Yes, it is true, only the work for the Lord can be counted for eternity (Rev. 22:12). Please pray that the Lord will give us the wisdom and protection continually.
