"Countless times in scripture we are told that it is only through God that we can live abundantly and in His peace, **whether we can see His gifts to us or not**." [emphasis added]

If we are honest, we tend to rely on tangible and visible "solutions." We have heard about the miracles that God has done in the Bible, and we say we believe in God's ability to help us. The snag comes when we personally have to rely on God's solutions. His ways and His times are not always according to our expectations. Isaiah 55:8 says, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways,' declares the LORD." Believing God has worked in someone else's life is easier than waiting for God to work in our own life. When we are living through it in real time, we struggle to see what God is doing in our timeline.

Singer Toby Mac puts it this way in a song about God coming to help. "I heard your heart, I see your pain. Out in the dark, out in the rain. Feels so alone, feels so afraid. I heard you pray in Jesus' name. May be midnight or mid-day. He's never early, never late. He will stand by what He claimed. Lived enough life to say... Help is on the way." Even though Toby Mac is a successful Christian artist, he has experienced much personal pain. He has learned to rely on God's help coming at the right time.

Trusting God does not always provide tangible and visible solutions. The nation of Judah was rebelling against God and not listening to His warning. He promised them salvation if they returned and rested in Him, assuring them that His strength was perfect for them. Yet they refused and instead trusted neighboring Egypt for help. Egypt provided horses that could be seen, but the Egyptian solution did not help. The lesson was that God does accomplish what we need, when we wait on His help.

Do we require a visible solution or will we trust God to help us in His way? Here is a reminder. God does provide a visual for us. God claimed us as His own precious child in the waters of Holy Baptism. Every day you see water, it is a reminder that God promised to "be here" for you. In the Sacrament of the Altar, we see bread and wine. When we physically receive these visible elements, we are also receiving the body and blood of Jesus. The Sacraments are visual reminders of the God who is with us. He delivers His invisible love and grace to us in visible ways.

It is tempting to rely on what we can see and touch, but God encourages us to live by faith in what He can do, whether we can see His gifts to us or not. God does not always work in visible ways, but there are three visible means through which God will bring us abundant life and peace. If you want true life and peace, then look to your Baptism, regularly receive the Lord's Supper and read the Written Word of God (the Bible). In Baptism, God promised to wash away your sin and claim you as His own child. He will never forsake you. Every time you receive the Lord's Supper, God gives you the grace that was intended for you on account of the physical suffering and death of Jesus. Every day, God desires for you to hear Him speak to you through the Bible in your time of need (and when things are going great). There are many ways God works that are not so visible, but here are the sure ways we can know that God will help us. I pray we will rely on these gifts from God, because He is always working to help us.
