A Message from Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When Israel left Egypt, their routine was changed. Eventually their supplies ran out and they had to depend on God to provide for their daily needs. As God guided them to the Promised Land, there was not a day that He failed to provide for and bless them. Read a great summary of this in Deuteronomy 8.

Our daily bread also comes from God. However, we do not always see God as the source. We have such a reliance on our own effort and our reserves of food in the pantry and freezer. Last month the power oputage in Millington showed how vulnerable and reliant we are to our power "grid" (our little god). Knowing how God has provided in the past enables us to trust He will do it again. Faith acknowledges that God is able to take care of us even when we share what we have.

God is able to provide for and bless us even when it loks impossible. When we face scarcity, we are also tempted to hold on to what we have for ourselves. God has a different plan. He encourages us to share. Jesus fed the 5,000 and the 4,000 with only a little from a few (see Mark 6 & 8). Knowing how God has provided in the past enables us to trust He will do it again. Faith acknowledges that God is able to take care of us even when we share what we have.

Everyone has spiritual needs as well. God wants to be the source for these needs and to provide for them all also.

Like Israel, God provides what we need, and He provides all that we need. Recognizing that God is our true provider creates and fosters gratitude.

Think about all the physical and spiritual blessings that you have received from God

each day. Let others see your gratitude to God, as you pass on the physical and spiritual blessings He has provided.

At St. Paul, God provides all we need, so that we can all earn to share. Enjoy the journey with God.

The Bookeeper's Corner

On June 30th we passed the 6th month milestone for our CY19 budget. I decided to print the entire budget as the Council sees it rather than a condensed copy for the congregation. This is important as we're entering the CY20 budget cycle and the income-to-expense ratio is very poor.

Things to note about the budget:

- a) After 6 months, the % of budget figure should be hovering around the 50% mark.
- b) Line 40200 Education: % of budget is 32.39% which is very low. However, folks are starting to register.
- c) Line 40300: Elders % of budget is very high this is due to a contribution toward a project.
- d) Line 40501: Envelopes tithing is down
- e) Line 40504: Other offerings down
- f) Gross Profit: 43.39% down 7% which is significant
- g) Line 56000: Hourly wage cost down snow days, time off, etc.

Summary:

- a) Total income is 43.39% of the budget
- b) Total expense is 48.81% of the budget

We are not bringing in enough money to pay our bills. It's as simple as that.

The voter's will be given the first look at the CY20 budget at the August assembly. Health care costs are taking a significant hike in 2020 and the projected income isn't going to cover health care and wages let alone operating expenses. Tough decisions will need to be made – we need YOU to be part of the solution. Please come to the voters assembly on August 11th and make your thoughts known.

Church Records

The church has begun its overhaul of the database and needs your help. Each member of this congregation (and many non- members as related to the member) has a record in the church office. The records contain not only simple demographic information, but information that cannot be found anywhere else: dates such as baptism, confirmation, wedding, transfer in, transfer out, etc.

The records are stored **for your lifetime** as long as you remain a member of this congregation. Your record is the single source document the pastors use for visits, hospital calls, church directory, and most importantly – funerals.

The new electronic records database is called **Shelby Membership and** every single person in the congregation has an account that can be accessed via computer or mobile app. You just need to request access. How to request access? Please fill out a database form and return to the church office or the box in the narthex as soon as you can. The form can be found in the church office and the narthex. Even if you do not wish to access your account, we still need the form filled out.

Shelby Membership will also become our single source for the church and school all-call. We are building brand new all-call lists and you must request placement on the lists. If you're on the current all-call lists, you will <u>not</u> automatically be placed on the new list. You must request access via the same form as the database form. If we do not receive your request to be placed on the new all-call list, you will not receive any calls.

How You Can Help

- 2. Whether you are a pledge donor or not, **PLEASE bring all your cars** up to be washed on August 18th. Tell everyone you know to bring their vehicles up for a **FREE** wash. When we say free, we mean it, and donations WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED the day of. This is important, so that you and those in our community that participate do not feel guilted into giving at what we are advertising as FREE.
