A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have just observed Thanksgiving and now many of us are preparing for Christmas.

For Christians, November and December host special holidays that actually influence us all year round. Thanksgiving is not just a one day event for food, family and the beginning of the Christmas shopping season. **Thanksgiving is a way of life**, as we look at all the blessings God has bestowed on us throughout the year and our lives. 




