A Message from Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

You and I are GIFTED.

What does that mean? We are unique in our individual abilities, however we are collectively gifted by our God with love and forgiveness through our Savior Jesus, whose birth we will celebrate this month,

Personally speaking, I think our culture has lost the purpose behind each act of giving a gift. There are times we may feel obligated: for a co-worker, for a classmate or teacher, or for the host of an event. We may feel pressure to give to family, certain friends and even acquaintances. All of this misses how the real purpose of giving a gift is to express love for the recipient. The sincerest gift is the result of love.

From a Christian perspective, I would say the origin to give gifts is God. As a result of love, He promised a Savior and then gave us the gift. We are familiar with the words, "For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is giver!" (Isa. 9:6a). The name of the gift is Jesus (1 John 4:10; Matt. 1:21). As you consider God's GIFT this Christmas, I pray that you will share your GIFTEDness of love with others in the name of our Savior Jesus.





The Bookeeper's Corner

To no one's surprise, this article is all about the budget for 2020. This is your first glimpse at the numbers the voter's will be presented at the assembly on Sunday, December 15th at 1:30 p.m. (note the date change!) You will be asked to vote in a deficit budget, or motion for the Boards to go back to the drawing board.

As of this writing (November 20th), our general fund is showing a deficit of (\$39,528.62) for the month of November. I anticipate we will not only end 2019 with a deficit, but our over-all-time numbers will drop from a surplus to a deficit. We are spending more money than we are taking in. It's that simple.

Here's how the budget stands today:

The Council will be proposing a \$46,741 deficit for calendar year 2020. Note no money is allocated for Evangelism, Fellowship, or Social Concerns. These Boards should be funded by our congregation, but the money is not there.

Reasons for the deficit are too numerous for this article; please come to the Voter's Assembly on December 15th to hear the discussion. Please -- bring actionable solutions.

Report of the 67th Regular Convention of The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (Continued)

Floor Comm. #10 - Ecclesiastical Supervision and Dispute Resolution

Res. 10-03A To Give Thanks to All who Worked to Complete the Process Outlined by 2016 Resolution 12-14, "Regarding the Right of an Accuser to Appeal When a District President or President Fails to Act or Declines to Suspend". Apparently there is a history behind this regarding Ecclesiastical Supervision related to the role of the Synodical President. The COP, although voting in the majority on the issue behind this resolution, is divided. Constitutionally, the Synodical President is given ecclesiastical authority over all of Synod. It was moved to postpone this resolution until the COP comes to better agreement. Adopted 60.9% in favor.

Floor Committee #11 - Church and Culture

- Res. 11-01 To commend the paper, "The Child as a Gift of God" to members of Synod and congregations, to fill the position of LCMS Director of Life and Health Ministry, to have CTCR updated its 1981 report on Human Sexuality and review various document on beginning of life issues, to request LCMS Life and Health Ministries collaborate with supportive groups to sponsor conferences on beginning-of-life issues and encourage our seminaries and colleges, districts, circuits, congregations and schools to give increased attention to these, and request the ONM to identify resources for these issues. Adopted 97.7% in favor.
- Res. 11-02A That the LCMS reaffirm its commitment to the biblical definition of marriage between one man and one woman, that same-sex "marriage" cannot be recognized as marriage according to God's institution, that Synod teach and confess that what God has joined, let not man separate, that sexual relations outside of marriage is unscriptural, that congregations hold firm to a faithful confession of marriage despite outside influences, that the church remain a friend to all sinners and that people would be called to repentance and be absolved. Adopted 96.4% in favor.
- Res. 11-03 We affirm and faithfully confess the biblical truth that God created humanity as male and female. We regard all those who experience sexual orientation and gender identity issues as our neighbors, beloved of God and condemn acts of abuse against them. We will minister compassionately to families, friends, and all impacted by those who struggle with same-sex attraction and utilize all reports related to these issues from the CTCR. The ONM, CPH, Seminaries, and CUS should provide resources to enable the church to confess the truth and minister to those with these struggles. Adopted by unanimous voice vote.
- Res. 11-04A We publicly condemn the sin of racism in all its manifestations and we encourage all congregations of the Synod to work toward racial reconciliation and equality within the Church and society-at-large. We as followers of Christ regard no one according to the flesh. Adopted by unanimous voice vote.
- Res. 11-05A That we be encouraged to see the immigrant and the stranger as our neighbor and to share the Gospel and make disciples of all people. As members we give bold witness in keeping with Scripture and our confessions against inhumane treatment and attitudes of immigrants and minorities and war refugees. We are encouraged to not let political divisions become church divisions. Adopted 89.4% in favor.
- Res. 11-06A To voice the LCMS opposition to physician-assisted suicide and legislative efforts to legalize it. Adopted unanimously by voice vote,
- Res. 11-07A To remember the persecuted church and utilize the CTCR bible study, "Why are you persecuting me? A Christian response to hostility and persecution." To pray for and financially support through the OIM missionaries and Christians who are being persecuted.
