The simplest yet greatest glow I know is a candle at the Christmas Candlelight service. This simple thing connects my heart and mind to one of the greatest love stories of all time.

Here is part of the story. There was a very dark place filled with tremendous pain and suffering. God came into this darkness as a small fragile light. Although the light was small, it was able to drive away the darkness wherever it was. In this light there was unconditional love for any and every person.

If you are reading this, you probably know this love story.

Bob Hope was known for bringing joy and hope to others, especially through his work with the U.S.O. His love for life and comedy made dark and heavy hearts laugh, but he was not the Light.

Jesus is the Light that brings joy and hope to others.

6 There was a man sent from God whose name was John. 7 He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. 8 He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

9 The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world.

As we approach Christmas, bring joy and hope to others. Keep it simple.

• Think of someone right now who is "in the dark."

• Pray and ask God to help you bring the Light (Jesus) into the darkness of this someone.

• Tell this someone how a small candle reminds you of the greatest love story of all time.

• Invite a fellow church member, or someone who is not a member, to join you for weekend worship and the Advent and Christmas services.

God loved the world so much that He sent His only Son to be a single Light of hope in our dark places. Jesus brings Light into our lives and enables us to share this Light with others. I pray that you will have joy and hope in Jesus this month and always.

Dear Christian Parents,

Children learn the language of their parents because their parents speak to them from the very beginning. This is not just true for English, Spanish, or German. It is true for the language of the Church.

Parents, speak the language of the Church to your children from the very beginning. Don't wait until they are in confirmation class. Don't wait until they are in Sunday school. Don't wait until they can talk. Speak the language of the Church to your children from the very beginning.

Participate in weekly public worship while you're holding them as infants and let them feel the rise and fall of your chest as you speak, sing, and pray. At home, hold your infant on the piano or in your arms so he can feel its vibrations as you sing hymns. Say the Creed together as a family. Teach them the Lord's Prayer. Pray with them before meals, after meals, and at bedtime. Speak the language of the Church to your children from the very beginning, and they will learn it.

Requests are for projects and equipment not in the General Fund budget.

IRA Oualified Charitable Distribution

If you are age 701/2 or older, IRS rules require you to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) each year from your individual retirement accounts (IRAs). If this applies to you, you may be interested in a way to lower the income and taxes from your RMDs. An IRA qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a way you can help continue our work and benefit this year.

Benefits of an IRA QCD

- Avoid taxes on transfer of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to St. Paul
- Satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) for 2021.
- Reduce your taxable income.
- Make a gift that is not subject to the deduction limits on charitable gifts.
- Help further the work and mission of St. Paul.

How an IRA OCD Works

- Contact your IRA plan administrator to make a gift from your IRA to St. Paul. Any gift not designated will go to the General Fund.
- Your IRA funds will be directly transferred to St. Paul to help continue our important work.
- Please note that IRA QCD gifts do not qualify for a charitable deduction.
- Please contact your tax professional or financial advisor for more information.

What is Thrivent Choice?

Church Calendar

The Time of Christmas

Advent

Begins on the fourth Sunday Before December 25,

or the Sunday closest to the Festival of St. Andrew (Nov. 30), and ends with midday prayer on Dec. 24.

The Savior's birth is second in importance only to His resurrection on Easter Sunday. During the Time of Christmas, Christians reflect on God's great and gracious gift of Himself.

The Church Year begins with Advent (from Latin *adventus,* which means "coming into"), a four-week period of preparation before Christmas. The story of Jesus during Advent is the story of hope coming into the world. When the time was just right, God sent His Son, Jesus, into the world. The Advent season teaches us to prepare to receive Jesus, the hope of the world.

In Advent, we wait for our coming King.

Isaiah 7:14, 9:6, 11:1-2; Micah 5:2; Matthew 1:18-25;

Luke 1:26-38, 46-55

Advent Practices and Traditions

- The color for Advent is blue, which symbolizes anticipation and hope in our coming King. Violet can also be used during Advent as a symbol of our repentance in preparation for our coming King.
- We do not sing the Gloria in Excelsis in the Divine Service during Advent. This is the angels' song at Christmas, so during Advent we pass over this traditional Hymn of Praise in silent anticipation.



• It has become common to use an Advent wreath to mark the season. This wreath has four candles – one for each week in Advent. As these candles are lit each week, our anticipation mounts as we look forward to Jesus' coming.

• We gather for midweek services. These services heighten our awareness and anticipation for the celebration of Christ's coming in the flesh.

The Time of Christmas

Christmas and its Season

Begins with evening prayer on Christmas Eve and ends with midday prayer on Jan. 5th.

Christmas tells the story of Jesus as the long-awaited King who has finally come to save us. Jesus, God's Son, the King of heaven and earth, is born in Bethlehem-the Son of God is a baby lying in a manger.

The evening services of Christmas Eve mark the beginning of the Church's celebration of the Nativity of Our Lord. The season continues after Dec. 25th over a period traditionally known as the twelve days of Christmas. This season includes a number of lesser festivals: The Festival of St. Stephen, the first martyr, occurs on Dec. 26th. St. John, apostle and evangelist, is remembered on Dec. 27th. The death of the babies in Bethlehem (Matt. 2:16-18) is observed on Dec. 28th as the Festival of the Holy Innocents. The circumcision and naming of Jesus on the eighth day after His birth (Luke 2:21) is celebrated on Jan. 1st.

At Christmas, we worship our God made flesh.

Luke 2:1-24; John 1:1-18; Galatians 4:4-5

Christmas Practices and Traditions

- We sing the Gloria in Excelsis and join the angels at Christmas in their Hymn of Praise: "Glory be to God on high: and on earth, peace, goodwill toward men."
- The color for Christmas and its season is white, symbolizing the divinity, eternity, purity, light, and joy of Jesus Christ.
- Many Christians celebrate with special services during the Christmas season. A special Divine Service late on Christmas Eve reminds us how the angels announced the birth of Jesus to shepherds who were "keeping watch over their flock by night." On Christmas Day, we celebrate the Word of God made flesh and receive Him in the Means of Grace. And on Jan. 1st, eight days after His birth, we gather in worship to begin the year in His name, Jesus, which means "the Lord saves," for He has come to save His people from their sins.
