A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

If you stumbled across a fantastic treasure, what would you do? Last December, Patrick Morgan was doing his cleaning job in a Florida airport when he discovered an I -pad. That is quite a valuable find, but then he discovered \$13,000 tucked inside. That is even more amazing. What would you do? Patrick Morgan reported it to the proper authorities. Even when he was given a \$60.00 reward by the happy owner, Patrick gave this money away to others. Although the airport and his employer both honored Patrick with a recognition ceremony and monetary gift, Patrick said he wasn't looking for anything in return. It just felt good to do the right thing and "that's the bottom line."

In the church, the subject of money is often taboo. Would you agree that many Christians are not able to give more because they are struggling with day to day expenses? The solution to our physical needs is a spiritual one. As one of your spiritual shepherds, I urge you to grow in your faith. Take a journey into the teachings of the Bible on how to be a steward, not of what God lost but what God has intentionally placed under your management.

Stories of people doing the right thing are inspirational. I am sure you will rejoice with me over the wonderful progress being made to reduce our general deficit. God has moved hearts within our congregation to do the right thing at the end of 2012 and the beginning of 2013. Like Patrick, some have returned what was in their hands to the rightful owner, with no thought of getting any reward. I invite you to thank God for how He has been providing and pray that He will continue to move hearts to be open in the area of Biblical steward-ship.

Like Patrick, we do not do the right thing because we are looking to get something in return. However, God does work in amazing ways for those who trust Him with their financial decisions. That is what I heard from others when I attended the "Treasure Principle" Bible Study that was offered at St. Paul. I would say all of us grew closer to God and one another for several reasons.

- Our time as a group was blessed by hearing God talk through the Bible about finances.
- We learned that others face the same struggles we face.
- As others shared experiences about God teaching and leading them to trust Him in all areas of life, we learned we can trust God too.
- Instead of remaining isolated from others, the discussion reminded us how God's Word always applies to daily living.

As I mentioned, the subject of money in the church can be misunderstood. The real work we have as a church is to share the Gospel of Jesus and how He is Lord of our entire life. If we don't allow Jesus to be Lord of our finances then this will hinder our participation in the mission of the church. Take time to read 2 Corinthians 5:14-15 and the context of the following quote from chapters 8-9. "This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of God's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. Because of the service by which you have proved yourselves, men will praise God for the obedience that accompanies your confession of the gospel of Christ, and for your generosity in sharing with them and with everyone else." I continue to pray that God will help all of us to trust Him and grow in this arace of aivina.


