

TRUST & INVESTMENT - PERPETUAL GIVING FUND

When a member designates St. Paul Lutheran Church as a beneficiary of their estate, they can specify exactly where they would like their gift to go. Some examples might be, General Fund, Building Fund, Missions, School or the Trust and Investment Perpetual Fund. If you do not specify in your will/estate, your gift will go to the Trust & Investment Fund per the bylaws of the church constitution.

Members may elect to donate directly to Trust & Investment through memorials or by gifts.

Gifts to Trust & Investment are the gifts that keeps on giving.

Gifts are invested and the principal amount cannot be spent. The earnings will be spent on projects or equipment that are not budgeted in the General Fund (examples; special needs or unexpected events). Any recognized board of our church can apply for disbursements of such funds. Requests are reviewed by the Trust & Investment Committee to see if it meets the fund guidelines. If a request is approved by Trust and Investment Committee, the request will to the Voter's Assembly for final approval.

We currently are accepting applications for disbursement of available earnings. Applications are available online, or you can pick one up at the church office. Deadline for submitting applications is April 1, 2022. You can return the application in person to the church office or email to tdglady@yahoo.com.
