A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

If we were asked to assign a theme for February, what would it be? Because of Valentine's Day, "Love" might be the first choice.

Love is really the theme for every day, of every month, according to God. The Lord appeared to us in the past, [a] saying: "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness." NIV-84 Jer. 31:3 "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." ESV Lamentations 3:22-23

God is committed to a love that is unconditional (*agape* in the Greek).

Think of how difficult it is for God to love us unconditionally every day. In your daily life, what puts God's love to the test? Just one person can be a challenge, but God shows all of us this type of love.

"God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." NIV-84 Romans 5:8 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. 

The Bookkeeper's Corner

Coming soon – new on-line giving program!

In early December 2018 we received notice from Church Extension Fund (CEF) that they will no longer partner with our on-line giving platform, Vanco. CEF paid all fees (monthly statements and transaction fees) which means 100% of your giving went to the church.

CEF offered an alternative program called Kindrid effective January 1, 2019. CEF will underwrite the Kindrid monthly statement costs, but the transaction fees are passed onto the church.

You will have two methods of contributions: ACH (auto-bank withdrawal) and your debit/credit card. The fees the church absorbs are as follows:

- a) ACH: .5% of the gift + .30 cents
- b) Credit/Debit cards: 2.5% of the gift + .30 cents

Example: you give an ACH \$100 gift. The fees would be 50 cents for the transaction ($$100 \times .005$) plus .30 cents = .80 cents. The deposit to the church would be \$99.20. However, your account shows the entire \$100 gift as part of your tax statement.

You can contribute weekly, monthly, yearly; any amount to the listed funds; stop/start whenever you want; make a one-time gift or set up for recurring. You are in complete control. You can access your account at any time to see your contributions.

For those that want to participate, you will simply go to the St. Paul website, access the Kindrid platform, and set up your account.

We have a small group of members testing the program now – so far so good! You will hear more about the program and how to join from our Board of Stewardship in the coming weeks.

Sneak Peak: we're in testing phase of a church management program (ChMS) to replace the archaic Shepherd's Staff. Kindrid information will load right into this program, you will have a ChMS account, and you'll have everything in one place!

Trust and Investment Fund

We can thank our forefathers who had the wisdom to start this perpetual fund with a few thousand dollars. Today it has grown to over \$600,000. Your estate gifts to the Trust & Investment fund is the gift that keeps on giving.

Your gift is invested and the principal amount cannot be spent. The interest and dividends will be spent on projects or equipment that would not be part of the church's general fund budget. Any recognized board of our church can apply for disbursement of such funds annually. Requests will be reviewed by the Trust & Investment committee and if approved, the requests will go to the Voter's Assembly for final approval.

When a member designates St. Paul Lutheran Church as a beneficiary of their estate, they can specify exactly where they would like their gift to go. Some examples might be: General Fund, Building Fund, Missions, School or Trust & Investment. If you do not specify in your will/estate, your gift will go to Trust & Investment per the bylaws in the church constitution.

Funds distributed in the last 10 years - \$86,837.76. In 2018 we approved \$26,790.56. Available for disbursement in 2019 \$26,476.88.

Applications are being accepted for Trust & Investment disbursement for 2019 beginning February 1st thru April 1st. Forms are available for the board chairperson in the church office or on line.

If spendable funds are still available after the April voters meeting the committee will review future requests as we receive them.

STORY from "LEAP"... CALENDARS OF OUR LUTHERAN SCHOOLS FEATURE "LUTHERAN SCHOOLS WEEK" CELEBRATIONS

If you are reading these lines, you likely have association with a Lutheran congregation in the Great Lakes Bay Region of Michigan – a congregation holding membership with the "LEAP (Lutheran Education Advancement Plan) Alliance" of 23 Lutheran churches/schools. Many of the schools offer K-8 programs, many provide early childhood programs, and one offers a high school program. Among special events presently appearing on calendars of each of these schools are a full week's worth of celebration programs, learning experiences, commemoration activities, worship features, fun doings, and more, all residing under a heading of "Lutheran Schools Week."

Our Lutheran schools are worth being featured, praised, and celebrated. Quite a few of these schools will conduct Lutheran Schools Week activities during the week of January 27 through February 2. 


