It is written in an easy-to-read conversational style with short articles, sidebar features, and some humor. *Lutheranism 101* helps create a solid foundation of reference upon which a lifetime of sound teaching can be built. Explore the basics of Lutheran theology by digging into the history of Lutheranism and making connections between what Lutherans believe and what Lutherans do.


