Therefore, you are uniquely positioned to be the hands and feet of God in this place and at this time. That is not an accident. God intended you and me and all of us to be here together. We have all been sent with more purpose by God than we think.

We all have a vested interest in the present and future of St. Paul. With God's guiding and blessing, I am certain our best days are ahead of us.

#### Trust and Investment Fund

We can thank our forefathers who had the wisdom to start this perpetual fund with a few thousand dollars. Today, it has grown to over \$600,000. Your estate gifts to St. Paul are the gift that keeps on giving.

Your gift is invested and the principal amount cannot be spent. The interest and dividends will be spent on projects or equipment that would not be part of the church's general fund budget. Any recognized board of our church can apply for disbursement of such funds annually. Requests will be reviewed by the Trust & Investment committee and if approved, the requests will go to the Voters' Assembly for final approval. When a member designates St. Paul Lutheran Church as a beneficiary of their estate, they can specify exactly where they would like their gift to go. Some examples might be: General Fund, Building Fund, Missions, School, or Trust & Investment.

**If you do not specify in your will/estate**, your gift will go to Trust & Investment per the bylaws in the church constitution.

Applications for Trust & Investment funds will be available soon. Details to follow in upcoming Messengers and announcements.

#### Thrivent Action Teams

Did you know that if you're a Thrivent member, you can apply for a **\$250 gift card** to help with a service activity or fundraiser? 
