## **A Message from Pastor**

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This month, and specifically on the 4th of July, we celebrate, along with other things, the hard won freedom we have inherited as U.S. citizens. We are a nation and a people that absolutely focus on and live in freedom. However, what we often fail to remember is that we in fact are all born in slavery. Slavery to sin. People are never "free" in the sense that we are autonomous and truly self-reliant. All of us will always serve something. And apart from God and His grace, we would be in service to our sinful nature and the devil. Because of our corrupted and ruined nature, we can do no other. Period.

Yet, the gracious work of our Lord Jesus Christ upon the cross and empty tomb, given to us through the faith God the Holy Spirit created in us through the Word, has freed us from slavery to our sinful nature and the power of the devil. Now, in Christ, we can resist both, and instead live in freedom from condemnation and guilt. In Christ, we can live the life we were created to live, in loving service to God and to our neighbor.

For this freedom in Christ also comes with responsibility. We are not to use our freedom to the harm of others. Though there is no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus; though we are free in Him from having to keep the Law perfectly for our salvation (which can never be done of course); and though we do not have to worry about following certain rules or practices to secure our salvation, we are not free to live any way we want (which usually involves caving to the selfish desires of our old sinful nature, the Old Adam). Instead, we are free to love and serve with a godly, sacrificial attitude as we have first been loved and served by our Lord Jesus Christ. As St. Paul reminds us in Galatians 5:13: "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another."

Not only can we celebrate and live in the freedom we have as U.S. citizens, but we can also celebrate and live in the true freedom we have in Christ, loving our neighbors and especially our fellow believers. In such love, we will be aware of our calling to serve others, not using our freedom in Christ to harm them, but with a sacrificial heart, live lives that build each other up, rather than tear down or destroy.

Martin Luther summarizes this truth of the Christian faith this way: "A Christian is an utterly free man, lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is an utterly dutiful man, servant of all, subject to all." This Christian truth is a paradox. And yet, it is our reality as brothers and sisters in Christ. The Christian is at once utterly free in faith and a servant to all in works of love. Christian life is lived between these twin poles of faith and love.

May God bless you, your family, your friends and neighbors, our government and judges at the local, state, and national level, our first responders, and our military serving at home and abroad today and every day. And may you faithfully celebrate and live in the freedom we have, not only as U.S. citizens, but most especially as citizens of God's eternal kingdom.

You are created and loved by God the Father, redeemed and sent by Jesus Christ, and made holy and empowered by the Holy Spirit to live in Christian freedom.

## **Bookkeeper's Corner / Office News**

### The Bookeeper's Corner

Questions during the Voter's Assembly always make for good articles. The June assembly was no exception. The questions asked pertained to school tuition.

Over the summer we'll be accepting enrollment applications for PS  $-8^{th}$  grade. Here are the tuition fees for the 2019/2020 school year:

a) Preschool – 3 yr old - \$675
b) Preschool – 4 yr old - \$975
c) K-8 has graduated tuition scales:

Member: first child: \$1,250 Member: second child: \$1,000

Member: second child: \$1,00 Member: third child\*: \$750

Non-Member: first child: \$2,500 Non-Member: second child: \$2,250 Non-Member: third child\*: \$2,000

\*Tuition is capped at the third child

The preschool tuition was raised for the next school year with the intent of gaining a part-time preschool teacher. The raise in tuition is intended to help off-set the added wage/tax expense of a second teacher. You may recall last year we had two full sessions of 3 year olds and two full sessions of 4 year olds; we anticipate the same this year.

Remember that 100% of school tuition goes directly into the general fund to help offset school staff wages, benefits, and employer taxes. Our total wages, benefits and tax budget for the year is \$795,875: the school portion is \$539,654 or 68% of the total budget.

Another question received is "what accounts have less than \$500 and need funding"? Here are the accounts that are NOT part of the general fund and rely on individual contributions to keep them going:

- Christian Care
- Brass/Instruments
- Fellowship
- City Rescue

## \*\*Church Records\*\*

The church has begun its overhaul of the database and needs your help. Each member of this congregation (and many non- members as related to the member) has a record in the church office. The records contain not only simple demographic information, but information that cannot be found anywhere else: dates such as baptism, confirmation, wedding, transfer in, transfer out, etc.

The records are stored **for your lifetime** as long as you remain a member of this congregation. Your record is the single source document the pastors use for visits, hospital calls, church directory, and most importantly – funerals.

The new electronic records database is called **Shelby Membership and** every single person in the congregation has an account that can be accessed via computer or mobile app. You just need to request access. How to request access? Please fill out a database form and return to the church office or the box in the narthex as soon as you can. The form can be found in the church office and the narthex. Even if you do not wish to access your account, we still need the form filled out.

Shelby Membership will also become our single source for the church and school all-call. We are building brand new all-call lists and you must request placement on the lists. If you're on the current all-call lists, you will not automatically be placed on the new list. You must request access via the same form as the database form. If we do not receive your request to be placed on the new all-call list, you will not receive any calls.

This is both a wonderful outreach to our community (Who doesn't love something for free?) and a great way to support the work of our youth group.

## **How You Can Help**

There are two ways that you can help make this event a success.


