Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.... For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: 'You shall love you neighbor as yourself.'" (Galatians 5:1, 13-14 ESV)

July is a month often focused on fun and freedom for us. Lest we forget, we should remember how our freedom was obtained.

In 1776, a declaration of freedom was written and signed by many; and the United States of America was born. From the Revolutionary War until today, the freedom we have was purchased by the blood of many. We ought to reflect upon this freedom and use it wisely.

As Christians, a declaration of freedom was spoken by Christ from the cross. Imprisoned in our sins, Christ dies in our place in order to obtain our freedom. Signed with His blood, Christ declared our independence. He purchased and won us from all sin, from death, and from the power of the devil with His blood. We are to reflect upon this freedom and use it wisely.

Martin Luther said, "A Christian is the most free lord of all, and subject to none; a Christian is the most dutiful servant of all, and subject to everyone." This means, in Christ, we are free, but we are to use our Christ-bought freedom to love and serve our neighbor. As Paul writes in Galatians, "For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself.""

Here at St. Paul, our theme is *Equip. Build. Grow. Together.* based on Ephesians 4:11-16. Christ equips you, as a free brother or sister, to carry out acts of service, "which God prepared beforehand, that [you] should walk in them." (Ephesians 2:10) Simply using our freedom as Americans to read the Bible, study it, and worship every chance we get is wise and God-pleasing. It will build you up as well as equip you all at the same time. The more we do these things, the more obvious it will be to us to love and serve our neighbors in Christ's name.

This July, celebrate our freedoms: both as Americans, and most especially as Christians. Tell those you know about true freedom in Christ, for many are still imprisoned by sin. The Lord wants all to be saved and freed in Christ. For on the Last Day, when Christ returns, our eternal freedom will be fully realized. And we will live in true freedom forever.


**The Activity Center Floor is off limits** July 10th-23rd while it is being refinished. Please do not use the Activity Center during this time.

# Mark Your Calendars for a \*\*\*Free Carwash!! \*\*\*

#### August 20<sup>th</sup> from 10:30AM-2PM

This is a fundraiser to help support the Jr. High and Sr. High Youth groups!



#### **How It Works**

The youth are asking for pledges (usually about 5-25 cents per car) before the car wash – just fill out the pledge sheet and bring to the church office or put in the offering box. We will wash as many cars as possible, **FOR FREE**, on August 20<sup>th</sup>. This is both a wonderful outreach to our community (Who doesn't love something for free?) and a great way to support the work of our youth group.

#### **How You Can Help**

There are two ways that you can help make this event a success.

- 1. Sign up to be a pledge donor. This will be a small amount (generally between 5-25 cents) that you are willing to give per car that we wash on the 20<sup>th</sup>. For example, if you offered to donate 25 cents per car, and we are able to wash 100 cars, your total gift would be \$25. If you pledge 10 cents a car, and we wash the 100 cars, your donation would be \$10. Please fill out the pledge sheet on the back of this page and return to the church office.
- 2. Whether you are a pledge donor or not, PLEASE bring all your cars up to be washed on August 20<sup>th</sup>. Tell everyone you know to bring their vehicles up for a **FREE** wash. When we say free, we mean it, and donations WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED the day of. This is important, so that you and those in our community that participate do not feel guilted into giving at what we are advertising as FREE.

#### **Letter from the Stewardship Committee**

#### **HOW MANY PLACES ARE CLOSE TO YOUR HEART?**

For over 100 years God has provided St. Paul Lutheran Church and School with a special place to come together as a family.

Our family worked together in many areas, and when needed came together to provide appropriate facilities to serve as our church and school.

For many years now, our family has focused on improvements and additions to the school, and now we have a wonderful school campus.

Our church structure is now over 50 years old. This is our family home, where we come to marry, to be baptized, eat and drink the body and blood of Jesus Christ. The place where we celebrate life's milestones, and because of our saving Lord we can even celebrate the death of a family member.

Our church structure is now in need of vital repairs. These repairs are due to over 50 years of family use, weather and other factors. Our family's handymen (our Board of Trustees) have done a great deal of background work evaluating what might need attention. To be sure nothing was being missed, an independent firm was hired to evaluate the building's needs. The result of this study is a detailed list of items needing repair. Some items need to be done now. Some items can wait a short time, but will need to be done. Others we can actually do ourselves.

All items were placed into one of five categories: critical, important, necessary, maintenance and additional. The estimated expense to do all five categories is \$1,002,717. Since some items can wait and some can be done ourselves, the Voters' Assembly, at their June 14, 2023 meeting, decided to proceed with items in the critical, important and necessary categories. The total expense for these areas is estimated at \$653,000.

The plan is to take a loan from Church Extension Fund for the needed funds and to spread the payments out over 25 years. The hope would be that our family can pay this off well before the 25 years. This 25-year payment plan would result in a monthly payment of about \$3,500.

Will the family support this plan? There really is only one way to find out, and that is to ask. The month of September will be one filled with information found online, in mailings and during worship. During the week of September 18<sup>th</sup>, your family will receive a card on which you can indicate how much your family will provide to support this project. On the weekend of September 30<sup>th</sup>/October 1<sup>st</sup>, your family will have the opportunity to deliver your support cards during the church services.

Once the level of support is verified, the final decision can be made on which repairs to proceed with and also on the size of a needed loan.


More detail into the needed work is now available at the congregation's website. Click on "more," then at the bottom, click "sanctuary repairs." Much more information will be coming your way. As a family let us join in prayer and praise regarding this project.

All funds for this project will be given through our family's new fund, the *Facilities and Properties Improvements Fund*. Any money designated to this fund between now and September will lower the amount of loan needed. To give to this fund, special envelopes are available in the narthex. Donations can also be made online or you may use a plain envelope marked *Facilities and Properties Improvements Fund*.
