THE LUTHERAN CHURCH MISSOURI SYNOD Dear Brothers and Sisters in our Heavenly Father's Family,

Arnie Ruddinger is a man who serves Christ and has helped many young people over the years. Ironically, Arnie's eyes were blurred with tears as he read a letter from his own 40 -year old son, Jeremy. "Dad, I've longed for most of my life to have a really close relationship with you. But so far it hasn't come about. It's important that I tell you this is a deeply felt need. And I'd like to see it happen."

The truth is many of us can relate to the need for improved relationships. Jeremy acknowledged the presence of pain, but he also wrote words of hope. "And I'd like to see [a really close relationship] happen."

It is never too late for fathers to reconnect. It didn't happen overnight for Arnie and Jeremy, but the determination, of both father and son, to build a stronger connection brought gradual improvement.

Father's Day is a time to reflect on our relationships and the deep desire for "a really close relationship." Regardless of who begins the process, it is worth the effort.

Malachi 4:6 says God may put someone in your life to encourage you to connect. "*He will turn the hearts of the fathers to their children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers.*" If it takes an annual observance like Father's Day, then don't hesitate to turn your hearts to each other. Our hearts will grow closest when they have been filled with God's love. The Lutheran Study Bible footnote for Mal. 4:6 says, "When fathers and children have a good relationship, the way is prepared for the coming of Christ into their hearts."

Healthy relationships flow from a healthy relationship with God. God is love and the Holy Trinity is the epitome of a close relationship. For us to experience the healthiest relationship, we will need the help of the One who is perfect at close relationships. Explore God's love for you and how this love can flow in words and actions toward others. "Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God.... This is how God showed his love among us: He sent His one and only Son into the world that we might live through him" (1 John 4:7, 9). God initiated the process and is determined to be in a very close relationship with us, so that we can be close to each other.

Jesus came to show us that God (the Father, Son and Holy Spirit) wants a really close relationship with you and me. Understanding what God did to connect with us will show us the way to connect with each other (1 John 4:10-12; Rom. 5:8; Phil. 2:1-11).

What about our relationships? There is hope, because our God desires for us to have these close relationships.
