Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What would be the answer, if you ask a father what he wants? Of course this is difficult to narrow down to just one thing. Most fathers (along with everyone else) would probably say he just wants to get some **rest**.

Time has become more valuable than money. Getting **rest** during our time is even more precious. Therefore, rest may be what is requested the most.

Have you ever considered that God knew what he was saying in the commandment about taking a Sabbath (a rest)? "Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work... (including a list of everyone and all animals associated with you so that they....) may rest, as you do. 

Livestream FAOs

How many cameras are there?

Five (so far). The two main cameras sit in the balcony and can zoom into the front of the sanctuary and be pointed as needed. One camera is hiding in the front of the church for the altar, choir, and processional views. Two additional static view cameras can be used as needed.

I'm interested in helping. How much of a time commitment is it? Depends how long Pastor's sermon is. The operator should be there 15 minutes before the service to make sure everything is ready to go. Once the service is done, it only takes a few minutes to shut things down.

How often would I need to serve?

No more than once a month unless you want to do more. You can volunteer for more services around Lent/Easter or Advent/Christmas.

Streaming sounds complicated. Is it?

Not when you use the magic buttons. Most of the camera views are automated and require a single button push to set up. The most difficult part is anticipating the next step to be prepared for it. Full training will be provided.

The sound board looks scary. Is it hard to use?

Depends. For a traditional worship service, the sound board is fully automatic, and you don't have to touch it at all. For Praise Team services, there would ideally be two team members on these weekends, so one can monitor sound while the other manages cameras.

How did this ministry start and grow?

In December of 2019, a trial run was put together to see if it was possible. When COVID closed everything down, we threw together some baby video monitors, stepladders, old cell phones, and three separate computers and were able to get something running without missing a weekend. Through generous personal donations and Trust Investment disbursements, we were able to upgrade to the state-of-the-art system we have now.

The Time of the Church - The Season After Pentecost

Begins the day after Pentecost and ends on the Saturday before the First Sunday in Advent.



The Sundays after Pentecost make up the longest portion of the Church Year. This is the Time of the Church - the time we focus on growing together in the life of the Holy Trinity.

On the first Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates Holy Trinity Sunday. We are baptized into only one name, but that name is "of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." there is only one name, only one God - but there are three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. On this Sunday, we confess the great mystery of the Holy Trinity.

The Sundays of this time of the Church Year are known as Sundays after Pentecost (or Sundays after Trinity.) Picking up on Pentecost as the season of growth, they are often referred to as the Green Sundays. The readings focus on the life of Christ in His Church. We hear Jesus teaching His disciples and healing the faithful.

Because the Pentecost season is part of "ordinary" time, congregations may choose to observe some of the lesser festivals of the season.

When saint days or commemorations fall on Sundays, worship leaders could highlight these to offer teaching moments about the breadth of the Church's life and work. These noteworthy days enable Christians to reflect on how we worship "with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven."

On the Last Sunday after Pentecost, the Church gives voice to the joyful hope of the second coming of Jesus for the resurrection of the dead and the last judgment. The end-times focus of the Last Sunday of the Church Year bears themes of hope and preparation that are similar to those of Advent, which soon follows.

During the Time of the Church, we focus on growing together in the life of the Holy Trinity.

Acts 2:41-47 * Ephesians 1:15-23 * Ephesians 3:14-19 * Colossians 3:12-17

Practices and Traditions

- The church is decorated in green, the color of growing plants. This marks the season of growth in living in our Baptism and receiving the Lord's Word and Sacraments.
- On Trinity Sunday, we confess the Athanasian Creed, which goes into great detail to confess the catholic (universal) faith that must be faithfully and firmly believed to be saved: "that we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity."
