Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Why do you observe Lent? Maybe you've never been asked this question, so you've never given it much thought. So, please take a moment and think of your answer.... Go ahead.... I'll wait.... Seriously.... Don't keep reading without thinking of your answer.

(Admit it, you kept reading, didn't you?)

Historically, Lent is the period of penitential (repentant) preparation for Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday (this year, February 26, 2020), six and a half weeks before Easter (April 12, 2020), and provides for a 40-day fast (Sundays are excluded), in imitation of Jesus Christ's fasting in the wilderness for 40-days before He began His public ministry. (This is why we read of the Temptation of Christ on the 1st Sunday of Lent every year.)

A period of preparation and fasting likely has been observed before Easter since apostolic times, though the practice was not formalized until the First Council of Nicaea in 325AD. It was a time of preparation of candidates for baptism and a time of penance for sinners. Strict fasting rules, such as one meal a day and abstaining from meat, fish, eggs, and butter, were kept. In addition, a focus on almsgiving (giving financial assistance to the poor, widowed, and orphaned) was observed.

To this day, many Christians often choose to give up specific pleasures during Lent, such as sweets, alcohol, coffee, or social media, as a way to foster simplicity and self-control. Many use their cravings or desires for these items as a reminder to pray and to refocus on Christ. In some Christian traditions, almsgiving, preparation of candidates for baptism or confirmation, and penance are still actively followed.

So. Why do you observe Lent? (If you didn't answer before, this is your last chance.) Do you observe Lent out of habit? Is it out of

guilt? Do you observe Lent because that's what you're supposed to do as a Lutheran? Do you give up something just so you can fit it in or brag about it? Why do you observe Lent?

Giving up sweets or coffee, giving more of your time or money to those who have less, reflecting on your own sin, these are all well and good. But let's face it, most of us, after 40-days of giving something up, are going to indulge in that thing we've forgone as soon as Easter Sunday rolls around. If you don't know why you're doing it, you're missing the point of Lent. So why do you observe Lent?

My prayer as your pastor, is that you observe Lent to remember what our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, has done for you. How He gave up everything He had so that you might gain everything He has in return. During Lent, we remember, and sometimes simulate on a basic level, the suffering Jesus endured in order to win our freedom from sin, death, and the devil. Because of this, when Jesus returns on the Last Day, when we experience our own Easter, we will enjoy the riches and blessings of our God forever.

Please take the time this Lenten season to really think about this question: Why do you observe Lent? Make time to attend our midweek Lenten services on Wednesdays at 1:30pm or 6:30pm (February 26, March 4, 11, 18, 25, April 1). Join us as we remember in real time Christ's Passion during Holy Week (April 9 @ 7pm and April 10 @ 1:30pm and 7pm). Read through the Gospel of Matthew, or any other Gospel (Mark, Luke, or John). Take time to pray every day. Think about how you manage all the resources and blessings God has given you to manage. And prayerfully reflect on what Jesus Christ has done for you and for all who believe.

When a member designates St. Paul Lutheran Church as a beneficiary of their estate, they can specify exactly where they would like their gift to go. Some examples might be (General Fund, Building Fund, Missions, School, or Trust & Investment.) If the gift is not specified, the gift will go to the Trust & Investment Fund per the bylaws in the church constitution. One estate gift was received in 2019.

Applications are being accepted for disbursement until April 1, 2020. Forms are available in the church office or online. If spendable funds are still available after the April Voters' Meeting, the committee will review any requests as we receive them.

From the Church Council

St. Paul Lutheran Church, as well as the greater Millington community, has been blessed by over 100 years of ministry and education provided by St. Paul Lutheran School.

Some years ago, the people of St. Paul launched a brave 3 phase building program to enhance the Christian education we provide. We are now blessed daily by modern classrooms, computer room, kitchen, library, and an outstanding gymnasium/activity center.

Only through the sacrificial giving of hundreds of people for many years has the blessing of this great campus been possible.

We are now approaching the end of our building fund debt, with just \$440,000.00 remaining on our building loan.

The Church Council wants to thank each of you for your continued support of the ministries of St. Paul Lutheran Church and School. As we go forward, it is our goal to complete paying off this debt ahead of schedule.

Our monthly payment for the building debt is over \$14,000.00. This money comes from church offerings designated for the Building Fund. When we receive more than what is needed for that month, the extra money is put into a Contingency Fund. We pull from this fund when we do not receive enough to cover the payment for any month. The problem is the Contingency Fund is almost empty.

To meet the goal of paying the fund off ahead of schedule, an increase in church donations designated for the Building Fund are needed. God has enabled us to pay down this mortgage over the years. We are asking the entire congregation to take time and prayerfully consider what God has given their family to help us sprint toward the finish line.

Please be sure any extra offering you may make toward the retirement of the Building Fund debt does not take away from your offerings toward the General Fund, as that fund is also struggling to stay ahead of bills, such as payroll.

We have been and will continue to be richly blessed by our God. We fully expect the blessing of this church and school will continue beyond another 100 years.

Thailand Mission Trip

Bob and I traveled to Thailand, "Land of Smiles" from November 30 to December 23, 2019. Our mission trip was to the Hmong school children of a village near Chiang Mai. Janette taught Christian songs and Christmas carols, reviewed the English alphabet, practiced saying phonetic sounds, and worked on simple sentences with the children in the 1st-3rd grades with the help of one of the Thai English teachers. God provided another young Hmong man who was visiting from Minnesota to be the additional English teacher for the 4th-6th grades. The children and teachers were so happy to see us! They were eager to learn English, and were so sad when it was time for us to leave. In this public school, teaching religious songs and talking about Jesus was not an issue, just a joy! Whereas 90 percent of Thailand believes in Buddhism, we hope through our ministry to the school children and showing our support of Dr. Fung Lo and his ministry by our presence in the villages, may many more seeds of Christian love be planted. Bob was a great help in the school kitchen and keeping our very rustic cabin filled with wood to take the chill off during the coldest week in Thailand. (40 deg) We went on several trips with Pastor Lo up into other mountains to visit Hmong villages as he oversees 16 pastors in South East Asia as part of the *Mission in Christ Network*. We also did two partial VBS(no crafts,) for children in other villages. Underlying in attendance is hunger, as presenting the gospel without providing food(like noodles in a cup) doesn't work. Hunger outweighs the message and they will not come.

Strength and endurance were a challenge for me this trip as I caught a cold from my co-teacher, the first week, and that developed into a sinus infection for the remainder of my stay. Bob and I then caught the "flu" from our plane ride back from Thailand, but we are happy to report that we are both healthy now. We ask for continued prayers for Pastor Lo and his family as he ministers to the pastors with words of encouragement and review of scriptures, and for protection as he enters the countries of Viet Nam, Cambodia and Laos as they continue to persecute Christians and Hmong people due to the previous war. Thank you again for all your love shown to us by your support through prayer, monetary donations, and words of encouragement. May God continue to bless your heart for missions.
