It may seem hard to believe, but the season of Lent is already under way. And as you probably know by now, our Lenten theme is: "Return to the Lord." Although we're already several days into the 40 days of Lent, I thought it would be good to unpack our Lenten theme a bit more.

In the book of Joel, the prophet paints a vivid picture of the coming judgment of God, the Day of the Lord. The imagery is bold and terrifying: hordes of locusts swarming over the land and decimating everything. Joel's prophecy has teeth even today as wars rage, natural disasters threaten and destroy, and our culture seems to be unraveling.

But right in the middle of this frightening warning, we find a tender invitation from the Lord: "Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster" (Joel 2:13). God's invitation and promise finds its fullness in Jesus Christ, who personifies and accomplishes all that God declares

During this season of Lent, we are examining how the call to return played out in practical ways for the people who walked alongside Christ. For it is Christ who demonstrated and carried out God's grace and mercy on our behalf, taking God's wrath upon Himself, setting the stage for God to "turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind Him" (Joel 2:17).

Each sermon for our Mid-Week and Holy Week services focuses on a particular event in the Passion of Christ, with a special focus on the people involved in the event. Studying the events and people helps to connect us with our own sinful nature, to emphasize how we have turned away from the Lord, and to reinforce and rejoice in God's call for us to return to Him with all our heart. We are further unpacking these events in our Sunday morning Bible study. Join us in-person or online Sun-

days at 8:45am to dig further into people and events in the Passion of Christ.

Lent is a multidimensional season of the Church Year, shaped by the preaching of our Lord's Passion, repentant reflection, and faithful instruction of God's Word. I encourage you to take advantage of all the opportunities we have to "Return to the Lord." For it is only in gathering around the Word of God and His Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion that we are "One in the Son."

So, if you've been away: "Return to the Lord." If you're disconnected: "Return to the Lord." If you've been betrayed, lied to, hurt, guiltridden, lost, questioning, doubting: "Return to the Lord." Whatever has been keeping you from a closer relationship with God, or from the Body of Christ here at St. Paul: "Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love...." (Joel 2:13).

TRUST & INVESTMENT – ESTATE GIVING

When a member designates St. Paul Lutheran Church as a beneficiary of their estate, they can specify exactly where they would like their gift to go. Some examples might be: General Fund, Building Fund, Missions, School or Trust & Investment. If you do not specify in your will/estate, your gift will go to Trust & Investment per the bylaws in the church constitution.

Your gift is invested and the principal amount cannot be spent. The interest and dividends will be spent on projects or equipment that would

not be part of the church's general fund budget. Any recognized board of our church can apply for disbursements of such funds. Requests are reviewed by the Trust & Investment Committee and if approved, will go to the Voter's Assembly for final approval.

We can thank our forefathers who had the wisdom to start this perpetual fund with a few thousand dollars. Today it has grown to over \$646,000.00. Your estate gift to the Trust &

Investment fund is the gift that keeps on giving.

We are currently accepting applications for disbursement of interest and dividends earned in 2020. Applications are available on line, or you can pick one up at the church office.
