Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Lent is here. Ash Wednesday is March 2. Beginning with Ash Wednesday and continuing through Holy Week in April, we invite you to our Wednesday night worship services at 6:30pm. Here, you will hear witnesses to Christ from the Gospel of John.

John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:30-31). Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life – abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life.

Historically, the Fourth Gospel is likened to an eagle – an image that suggests John soars to heights of glory and grandeur. That's because the evangelist paints a stunning portrait of Jesus, who is the bread of life (John 6:35), the resurrection and the life (John 11:25), and the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6). Life in Jesus. That's God'S gift to you!

This Lent, our life in Christ will be strengthened as we hear the witness of those in John's Gospel who journeyed to the cross. Along the way, we'll meet villains, such as Barabbas and Pontius Pilate, as well as sinners, such as Peter (who denied Jesus *three* times), Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by seven demons), and Judas Iscariot (who betrayed Jesus for *thirty* pieces of silver).

**Good Friday (April 15):** *John, the Gospel Writer,* John 19:25–37; *Nicodemus,* John 19:38-42

#### TRUST & INVESTMENT - PERPETUAL GIV-ING FUND

When a member designates St. Paul Lutheran Church as a beneficiary of their estate, they can specify exactly where they would like their gift to go. Some examples might be, General Fund, Building Fund, Missions, School or the Trust and Investment Perpetual Fund. If you do not specify in your will/estate, your gift will go to the Trust & Investment Fund per the bylaws of the church constitution.

Members may elect to donate directly to Trust & Investment through memorials or by gifts.

## Gifts to Trust & Investment are the gifts that keeps on giving.

Gifts are invested and the principal amount cannot be spent. The earnings will be spent on projects or equipment that are not budgeted in the General Fund (examples; special needs or unexpected events). Any recognized board of our church can apply for disbursements of such funds. Requests are reviewed by the Trust & Investment Committee to see if it meets the fund guidelines. If a request is approved by Trust and Investment Committee, the request will to the Voter's Assembly for final approval.

We currently are accepting applications for disbursement of available earnings. Applications are available online, or you can pick one up at the church office. Deadline for submitting applications is April 1, 2022. You can return the application in person to the church office or email to <a href="mailto:tdgla-dy@yahoo.com">tdgla-dy@yahoo.com</a>.
