Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Fatigued: to be tired or weary. Fatigued. It's a term we've heard more recently. We're fatigued from following COVID-19 guidelines and requirements. We're fatigued from protocols constantly changing. We're fatigued, but all we hear is the need to re-double our efforts and remain vigilant.

But we're fatigued by more than just the pandemic. We're fatigued by politics. We're fatigued by the worries and toils of daily life. We're fatigued and often running on fumes. But we're often told to keep pushing ahead.

In Jesus' day, the people were fatigued as well. The Pharisees (the church leaders of the day) had created a workload for holiness and salvation that was too heavy to bear. There were many rules, guidelines, requirements, and protocols to follow. And as people withered under this burden, the Pharisees reminded them of their need to re-double their efforts and remain vigilant. In many ways, the people of Jesus' day were fatigued by something way worse than a pandemic, politics, or daily strife. They were fatigued by the Law and their sin.

Enter Jesus. He tells the people in Matthew 11:28-30: "Come to Me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy, and My burden is light." Here, Jesus describes the "yoke of the Law" as heavy, and He offers an alternative: to be yoked with Him to the Gospel, which is light and offers forgiveness.

In addition, if you are yoked to Jesus, you will find rest. Martin Luther would say of this passage: "When sin has been forgiven and the conscience has been liberated from the burden and the sting of sin, then a Christian can bear everything easily. Because everything within is sweet and pleasant, he willingly does and suffers everything." This includes all the various trials and tribulations of the world we face on a daily basis.

Jesus has carried all our sins and sorrows to the cross. His presence and forgiveness lightens every load. Pray for Him to lighten, not only your burden of sin, but also the daily burdens you face. Lean on Him and His Word to re-energize and re-vitalize your faith and life.

Fatigued? Rest in Christ.


