Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What does it mean to be a witness? As a noun, "witness" means, "an individual who, being present, personally sees or perceives a thing; a beholder, spectator, or eyewitness". As a verb, it means, "to see, hear, or know by personal presence and perception; to be present at (an occurrence) as a formal viewer, spectator, bystander, etc." In other words, you have to have "been there" to see something with your own two eyes in order to be a "witness".

What if I told you that you are witnesses of the Risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ? "Ridiculous!", you say. "Why, I wasn't alive 2,000 years ago to see Jesus Christ, and neither were you." On the surface, that's true. But you have someone living in you who was there, who did witness the Risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. You have the Holy Spirit. As St. Peter confessed before the Jewish council, "we are witnesses to these things [the Crucified and Risen Jesus], and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey Him" (Acts 5:32 ESV).

Did you catch that? The Holy Spirit witnessed the death and resurrection of Jesus. So, not only did the Apostles witness the resurrected Jesus, the Holy Spirit witnessed the resurrected Jesus. And if that isn't enough, God gives the Holy Spirit to those who obey and believe in Him! That means, by faith, YOU have the Holy Spirit, which ultimately means YOU are a witness of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

And what does a witness do with what they've seen? A witness testifies to what he

or she has seen. And since, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we have seen the death and resurrection of Jesus, we are to testify "and speak to the people all the words of this life" (Acts 5:20 ESV). Now, you don't need to be like Peter and the Apostles, traveling from town to town, and house to house preaching the Gospel. However, you ARE to testify, to witness, what you have seen to those God puts in your life. And what you have seen is the Crucified and Risen Jesus, who gives repentance and forgiveness of sins to those who believe in Him.

In the power of the Holy Spirit, we can be a bold witness to the death and resurrection of Jesus even though we weren't alive to see it with our two eyes. For "we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7 ESV). Yet in faith and by the workings of the Holy Spirit, we clearly see Jesus. God has tapped us on the shoulder to witness to those who do not see Jesus. The Holy Spirit will guide us as we go. After all, He's the actual eyewitness; we are simply His voice testifying to what He has seen, and what, by faith given us by the Holy Spirit, we believe.

# The Time of the Church The Season After Pentecost

Begins the day after Pentecost and ends on the Saturday before the First Sunday in Advent.

The Sundays after Pentecost make up the longest portion of the Church Year. This is the Time of the Church the time we focus on growing together in the life of the Holy Trinity.

On the first Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates Holy Trinity Sunday. We are baptized into only one name, but that name is "of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." there is only one name, only one God - but there are three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. On this Sunday, we confess the great mystery of the Holy Trinity.

The Sundays of this time of the Church Year are known as Sundays after Pentecost (or Sundays after Trinity.) Picking up on Pentecost as the season of growth, they are often referred to as the Green Sundays. The readings focus on the life of Christ in His Church. We hear Jesus teaching His disciples and healing the faithful.

Because the Pentecost season is part of "ordinary" time, congregations may choose to observe some of the lesser festivals of the season.

When saint days or commemorations fall on Sundays, worship leaders could highlight these to offer teaching moments about the breadth of the Church's life and work. These noteworthy days enable Christians to reflect on how we worship "with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven."

On the Last Sunday after Pentecost, the Church gives voice to the joyful hope of the second coming of Jesus for the resurrection of the dead and the last judgment. The end-times focus of the Last Sunday of the Church Year bears themes of hope and preparation that are similar to those of Advent, which soon follows.

# During the Time of the Church, we focus on growing together in the life of the Holy Trinity.

#### **Practices and Traditions**

- The church is decorated in green, the color of growing plants. This marks the season of growth in living in our Baptism and receiving the Lord's Word and Sacraments.
- On Trinity Sunday, we confess the Athanasian Creed, which goes into great detail to confess the catholic (universal) faith that must be faithfully and firmly believed to be saved: "that we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity."

# **Worship by the Word**

#### Service of the Word

<u>Introit</u>: Here we "enter" (Introit) the service proper, with the Word of God in our ears. As the pastor moves toward the altar, he brings our attention together as we sing a portion of the Psalms.

Gloria Patri: A common refrain used in various parts of the service, it is usually associated with a Psalm. It echoes the words of Baptism in its use of the full Triune name (Matt. 28:19). It glorifies God in echoes of the song of angels, "Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost."

Kyrie: "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David," the Canaanite woman begs (Matt. 15:22). "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David," cried out two blind beggars (Matt. 20:30). "Lord, have mercy on my son," pleaded a nameless man for his son (Matt. 17:15). We also cry out in faith for our Lord to grant us mercy and healing. It is the most basic and comprehensive Christian prayer.

Gloria In Excelsis: The Gloria draws on a number of biblical passages, including Psalm 34:1-3; 105:1-3; Romans 15:6; John 1:29; Revelation 15:4; and other passages indirectly. The song of the angels from Luke 2 leads us into the canticle: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased" (Luke 2:14). Then we confess, in the words of John, that Christ is "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). In the Old Testament, a sacrificial lamb bore the sins of the people. Christ is the final sacrifice who bore the sins of the entire world.

Salutation: This "greeting" comes from Paul's closing words to Timothy: "The Lord be with your spirit" 2 Tim. 4:22). It parallels how Israel asked Moses to speak and act as God's representative. The congregation asks the pastor to serve in a similar special duty. These words spoken just prior to the Collect (Prayer of the Day) implore God's Spirit to be with the pastor as he prays to the Lord.

Readings: In the readings, God speaks. He speaks through the prophets, men of the Old Testament who wrote of the Christ who was yet to come. Then we hear from the apostles, usually the letters (epistles) of St. Paul. The crown jewel of the Service of the Word is the reading of the Gospel, the very words and earthly actions of Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

Nicene Creed and Apostles Creed: The creeds of the church grow directly from the teachings of Scripture. We speak this confession of faith together as a reminder of what we believe and confess before the world. In this confession, we encourage one another and renew our understanding of what we believe. If you want to know what Christians believe, this is a great place to start.

<u>Sermon</u>: Based upon the readings for the day, the pastor preaches the Sermon, speaking again what was already said. What the prophets longed to see and hear, what the apostles saw with their own eyes and witnessed to in the Gospels, the pastor now preaches and teaches to us. And we joyfully receive God's Word from this servant of God.

Offertory: The congregation sings a portion of Psalm 51 imploring God to work through the Word just preached to cleanse and purify the heart. We sing "Create in me a clean heart, O God."

Offering: An Early Church father, Tertullian, reported that pagans were amazed at how Christians cared for one another. St. Paul exhorts his congregations to take up offerings for the church, to provide both for church workers and all the brothers in need.

Prayer of the Church: Christians have always prayed according to St. Paul's direction to Timothy: "I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgiving be made for all people" (1 Tim. 2:1-2). Listen for these petitions and thanksgivings, as they relate to the day's readings.


