A Message from Pastor Martinal

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

A riddle: I am the beginning of the end, the end of every place. I am the beginning of eternity, the end of time and space. What am I? (Answer at the end)

May is often a busy month, filled with celebrations of beginnings and endings. Some of the things that begin in May: flowers, blossoms, leaves on trees, new birth, marriages (weddings), and summer (unofficially with Memorial Day weekend). But May is also a things end: formal education (graduations), Catechism class (Confirmation), school year (for some), time spent south (snowbirds return), and snow (hopefully).

As I said, May is often a very busy month for many of us. It's easy to get distracted by all the things beginning and ending in our lives. And when we get distracted, things we normally do tend to fall by the wayside in order to make room for those beginnings and endings. After all, there's still only 24 hours in the day.

As human beings, we are drawn to beginnings and endings. It's hardwired into our DNA. We are born (beginning) and we die (ending). Except, as Christians, we know death is not the end. In fact, we believe and confess that we will live, body and soul, forever. Still, we struggle with beginnings and endings because until the Last Day, we are only able to understand and operate with things either beginning or ending.

However, we believe in a God who is both beginning and ending, Alpha and Omega. Alpha and Omega are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. As such, this title underlines God's eternal nature. John, in Revelation 22:13, records these words of Jesus: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End." He is "the First and the Last", the Lord of the Church; "the Beginning and the End" of all creation, and soon the new creation; and "the Alpha and the Omega" of all eternity. This

underscores that these titles describing the eternal magnitude of the infinite God apply to Jesus Christ. All of which is to say that Jesus is God, always has been and always will be. Furthermore, in Jesus, we believe in a God who has been born and has died. All of us have experienced birth. Most of us will taste death. But through faith in Jesus Christ, "the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep", we will be raised as Christ was, body and soul (1 Corinthians 15:20). For "the last enemy to be destroyed is death" (1 Corinthians 15:26). Jesus delivers us from death's jaws. He now equips us to serve Him and our neighbors, and to live eternally in His kingdom, which has no end.

As we approach the summer months, I implore you to not let these things end until the Fall: keeping up with our *Bring It Home* Bible reading plan; attending worship (whether here or elsewhere while on vacation); attending Bible studies (on Sunday mornings or otherwise); holding family devotions; being fervent in daily prayer; giving a portion of what God has given you; being intentional about sharing the eternal hope you have in Jesus Christ. I'm sure you can think of many more ways to keep your faith from "ending" over the summer and "beginning" again in the Fall.

Remember, God the Father, through His Son, Jesus Christ, and the power of the Holy Spirit, will never leave you nor forsake you. God is with you always, even to the end of time. What a joy it is to worship and serve an eternal God: The Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End!

You are created and loved by God the Father, redeemed and sent by Jesus Christ, and made holy and empowered by the Holy Spirit to eternally worship and serve our eternal God.

The Bookeeper's Corner

At our April Voter's Assembly, the first quarter budget vs actual numbers were presented. There isn't enough room in the Messenger to print the entire report as presented to the Assembly, so here is a condensed version.

Things to note:

- a) At the end of the first quarter, our percentages (far right column) should be hovering around 25%
- b) Elders line 40300 shows a 318.18% over budget: there was a contribution toward a project
- c) Elders line 50300 shows a 33.31% over budget: expenses that offset the contribution above
- d) Trustees line 50800 shows 29.99% over budget: unexpected repairs/maintenance
- e) Wages-Hourly line 56000 shows 39.62% over budget: overtime in child care & hot lunch reimbursement check not deposited until April.

In summary, our total income is down a bit while our expenses are up a bit. Staying within 3% up or down of our total budget means we're managing our gifts fairly well.

Administrative News

Offering Envelopes

If you have ever questioned the accuracy of your giving statement, it's because the accuracy is directly tied to your envelope number. If you use a different envelope number, or none at all, we cannot bridge your offering to your account.

Each week a team of tellers take the weekend offerings and begin a very detailed sort of envelopes, loose cash, and a myriad of other things that get tossed in the plate. They meticulously check the amount written on the envelope with the content inside – if there is a discrepancy, the amount inside the envelope will be used versus what is written on the outside.

The money now goes to the bank for verification. Many times the deposit is kicked back because the bank will not accept post dated checks, checks with the wrong year, checks written in any color than black or blue, checks where the numerical dollar amount does not match the written dollar amount, or checks that are not signed. The tellers do their best to catch them each week, but the tellers are not machines and don't catch them all.

If the deposit makes it through, now the envelopes go to a team of bookkeepers. <u>Envelope numbers</u> <u>are tied to the individual</u>. If you use a different envelope number other than your own, the holder of that envelope number will receive the posting of the dollar amount.

If you place a loose check in the plate, the gift will automatically go to the general fund and the giving will NOT reflect on your account.

Each communicant member is assigned an envelope number. Husbands/wives are assigned one number. If a husband/wife team needs to separate their givings (usually for tax purposes), one of them needs to request their own envelope number.

In summary, using your assigned envelope number for your gifts ensures accuracy at tax time.

Note: none of this applies to on-line giving (Giving Plus)

Administrative News

Church Records

The church has begun its overhaul of the database and needs your help.

Each member of this congregation (and many non-members as related to the member) has a record in the church office. The records contain not only simple demographic information, but information that cannot be found anywhere else: dates such as baptism, confirmation, wedding, transfer in, transfer out, etc.

The records are stored for your lifetime as long as you remain a member of this congregation. Your record is the single source document the pastors use for visits, hospital calls, church directory, and most importantly – funerals.

The new electronic records database is called Shelby Membership and its current accuracy is marginal at best. Every single person in the congregation has an account that can be accessed via computer or mobile app. You just need to request access.

How to request access? Please fill out a database form and return to the church office as soon as you can. The form can be found in this Messenger as well as the church office and the narthex. Even if you do not wish to access your account, we still need the form filled out.

There's more. Shelby Membership will become our single source for the church and school all-call (also known as Church Call, School Reach, etc). We are building brand new all-call lists and you must request placement on the lists. If you're on the current all-call lists, you will <u>not</u> automatically be placed on the new list. You must request access via the same form as the database form.

All-Call Registration

A note about the All Call list: Many people want to be on the all call list (also known as Church Reach or School Reach); many people do not. We are creating new lists from scratch. You have the option on being on one or both of the lists as well as the option to receive mass contact information via voice message on a home phone or text/voice messaging on a cell phone.

How it works:

- a) The Church all-call will remain voice message due to its content -- messages about worship services and funerals are not text-friendly. You can use a land-line or cell phone for voice only.
- b) The School all-call has voice message to a land-line or cell-phone and text message to your cell phone capabilities. Here are the software rules to follow:
 - Home Phone: must be a landline (NO cell phone numbers)
 - Cell Phone voice: must be a cell phone where you want to receive voice messages
 - Cell Phone text: must be a cell phone with a data plan

c) Register!

Instructions: insert phone numbers where you want to be contacted. Example: if you fill out all five blocks below, you could be contacted five times depending on the information.


